AN ACT

To repeal section 32.300, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to remote systems for the performance of transportation functions by the department of revenue.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 32.300, RSMo, is repealed and one new

- 2 section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 32.300,
- 3 to read as follows:
 - 32.300. 1. In a county where personal property tax
- 2 records are accessible via computer, and when proof of motor
- 3 vehicle liability insurance, safety inspections and emission
- 4 inspections where required are verifiable by computer, the
- 5 department of revenue shall design and implement a motor
- 6 vehicle license renewal system which may be used through the
- 7 department's internet website connection.
- 8 2. The department of revenue shall also design and
- 9 implement an online system allowing the filing and payment
- 10 of Missouri state taxes through the department's internet
- 11 website connection. The online tax filing and payment
- 12 system shall be available for the payment of Missouri state
- 13 taxes for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2002.
- 14 3. The department of revenue or any fee office is
- 15 hereby authorized to design and implement, or to contract
- 16 with a third-party vendor for the provision of, a remote
- 17 system which may be used through the department's internet
- 18 website connection or through self-service terminals

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19 available at one or more locations within the state for 20 motor vehicle and watercraft transactions, including but not 21 limited to titling and registration. Any system provided by 22 a third-party vendor shall be clearly identified as being provided by a third party, and license offices shall process 23 24 transactions based on information provided by applicants through the system. No personal information shall be 25 26 transmitted from a license office through the system or to 27 the third-party vendor.

- 28 The department of revenue is hereby authorized to design and implement a remote driver's license renewal 29 system which may be used through the department's internet 30 31 website connection or through self-service terminals available at one or more locations within the state. 32 remote driver's license renewal system implemented by the 33 department shall be compliant with the provisions of the 34 federal REAL ID Act of 2005 (Public Law 108-13), as amended, 35 the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986 (Title XII 36 37 of Public Law 99-570), as amended, the USA PATRIOT Act of 2001 (Title X of Public Law 107-56), as amended, and any 38 regulations related thereto. 39
- 40 [3.] 5. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, applicants who have applied in person and received 41 a driver's or nondriver's license in accordance with chapter 42 302 may apply for no more than one consecutive three-year or 43 44 six-year license renewal remotely in accordance with this 45 section. Remote application for renewal shall be made within six months before or after the expiration date of the 46 license in accordance with section 302.173. 47
- 48 [4.] 6. Applicants for remote driver's license renewal 49 in accordance with this section shall not be required to 50 complete the highway sign recognition test required under

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51 section 302.173 unless the department has technology that 52 may be used remotely for such purpose. Applicants for remote driver's license renewal in accordance with this 53 section shall not be required to complete the vision test 54 55 established under section 302.175, provided the applicant shall certify under penalty of law that the applicant's 56 vision satisfies the requirements of section 302.175 and 57 58 that the applicant has undergone an examination of eyesight by a licensed ophthalmologist or a licensed optometrist 59 60 within the last twelve months. As a condition for renewal in accordance with this section, the applicant shall 61 authorize the exchange of vision and medical information 62 between the department and the applicant's ophthalmologist 63 or optometrist, and shall be at least twenty-one years of 64 age but less than fifty years of age. The ophthalmologist 65 or optometrist shall have four business days to confirm or 66 deny the vision and medical information of the applicant. 67 If no response is received by the department, the department 68 shall accept the vision and medical information provided for 69 processing the renewal application. 70
