AN ACT

To amend chapter 334, RSMo, by adding thereto thirteen new sections relating to the regulation and licensing of the practice of naturopathic medicine, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 334, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 thirteen new sections, to be known as sections 334.1051,
- 3 334.1053, 334.1056, 334.1059, 334.1062, 334.1065, 334.1068,
- 4 334.1071, 334.1074, 334.1077, 334.1080, 334.1083, and 334.1084,
- 5 to read as follows:
 - 334.1051. 1. As used in sections 334.1051 to
- 2 334.1084, the following terms shall mean:
- 3 (1) "Approved naturopathic college", a four academic
- 4 year in-residence, doctoral-level naturopathic medical
- 5 education program that is accredited by the Council on
- 6 Naturopathic Medical Education, its successor or equivalent,
- 7 and is located at an institution of higher education that is
- 8 accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by
- 9 the U.S. Department of Education;
- (2) "Board", the state board of registration for the
- 11 healing arts;
- 12 (3) "Department", the department of commerce and
- 13 insurance;
- 14 (4) "Diagnose", to examine another person, parts of a
- 15 person's body, or substances, fluids, or materials excreted,
- 16 taken, or removed from a person's body, or produced by a

person's body to determine the source, kind, or extent of a disease or other physical condition;

- 19 (5) "Natural medicine", includes:
- 20 (a) Food, food extracts, and dietary supplements as
- 21 defined by the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, 21
- U.S.C. Section 301, et seq., as amended;
- 23 (b) Plant, animal, mineral, and microbial substances 24 that are not designated as prescription drugs or controlled
- substances, including those described in section 195.017; and
- 26 (c) Homeopathic remedies and substances prepared
- 27 according to the Homeopathic Pharmacopeia of the United
- 28 States;
- 29 (6) "Naturopathic medicine" or "naturopathy", a system
- 30 of primary health care for the prevention, diagnosis, and
- 31 care of human health conditions, injuries, and diseases that
- 32 uses education and natural substances and remedies to
- 33 support and stimulate the individual's intrinsic self-
- 34 processes;
- 35 (7) "Naturopathic physical medicine", the use of the
- 36 physical agents of air, water, heat, cold, sound, light, and
- 37 electromagnetic nonionizing radiation, and the physical
- 38 modalities of electrotherapy, biofeedback, diathermy,
- 39 ultraviolet light, ultrasound, hydrotherapy, naturopathic
- 40 mobilization therapy, exercise, and other electrical devices
- 41 as approved by the board. The term does not include the
- 42 practice of physical therapy, acupuncture, or chiropractic;
- 43 (8) "Naturopathic practitioner" or "naturopath", a
- 44 person licensed to practice naturopathic medicine pursuant
- 45 to sections 334.1051 to 334.1084;
- 46 (9) "Topical preparations", topical analgesics,
- 47 anesthetics, antiseptics, scabicides, antifungals, and

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48 antibacterials. The term does not include controlled 49 substances described in chapter 195.

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- 2. Any person who is not currently a licensed naturopathic practitioner within the meaning of the law to practice naturopathic medicine in any of its departments shall not engage in the practice of naturopathic medicine in this state, except as provided by sections 334.1051 to 334.1084.
- 56 3. As used in the laws of this state, the terms 57 "naturopath", "practitioner of naturopathic medicine", "naturopathy", or similar terms shall be construed to mean 58 59 naturopathic practitioners licensed pursuant to this In this state, no practitioner of naturopathic 60 chapter. 61 medicine may use the title "doctor" in any manner or title 62 or hold himself or herself out to the public as "doctor", 63 "N.D.", or "N.M.D.".
- 4. The term "naturopathic" shall be used in any sign, letterhead, advertisement, solicitation, or other method of addressing the public.
 - 334.1053. Candidates for licensure as naturopathic practitioners shall furnish satisfactory evidence of their good moral character and their preliminary qualifications as follows:
 - (1) File an application with the department;
- 6 (2) Earned a degree of doctor of naturopathy from an 7 approved naturopathic college;
- 8 (3) Have experience as a naturopathic practitioner
 9 satisfactory to the board and in accordance with the board's
 10 regulations;
- 11 (4) Pass the naturopathic physician's licensing 12 examination (NPLEX), or its successor or equivalent 13 examination, as determined by the board;

- 14 (5) Be at least twenty-one years of age;
- 15 (6) Be a United States citizen or an alien lawfully
- 16 admitted for permanent residence in the United States; and
- 17 (7) Pay all application and examination fees required
- 18 by the board.
 - 334.1056. 1. There is hereby established an "Advisory
- 2 Commission for Naturopathic Medicine" for the purpose of
- 3 advising the board on the licensing and supervising of all
- 4 naturopathic practitioners. The commission shall consist of
- 5 six members, including one voting public member, to be
- 6 appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the
- 7 senate. At least four members of the commission shall be
- 8 licensed naturopaths. Each naturopath member of the
- 9 commission shall be a citizen of the United States and
- 10 actively engaged in the practice of naturopathy immediately
- 11 preceding his or her appointment. One member shall be
- 12 appointed from an appropriate healing profession, including
- 13 medicine, as a person licensed pursuant to this chapter. No
- 14 more than four members shall be affiliated with the same
- 15 political party. All members shall be appointed for a term
- 16 of four years. Each member shall receive compensation in an
- 17 amount set by the commission not to exceed seventy dollars
- 18 for each day devoted to the duties of the commission, and
- 19 shall be entitled to reimbursement for the member's expenses
- 20 necessarily incurred in the discharge of his or her official
- 21 duties.
- 22 2. The commission's initial naturopathic practitioner
- 23 members shall:
- 24 (1) Be actively practicing naturopathic medicine; or
- 25 (2) Hold an active license to practice naturopathic
- 26 medicine in another state where such license requires

27 passage of a professional naturopathic medical licensing

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- 28 examination.
- 29 The naturopathic practitioner members appointed to the
- 30 initial commission shall be licensed in accordance with
- 31 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 not later than one year after
- 32 establishment of the licensing rules and regulations. If,
- 33 for any reason, such a member cannot be licensed within such
- 34 time period, a new member shall be appointed.
- 35 3. The initial appointments to the commission shall be
- 36 one member for a term of one year, one member for a term of
- 37 two years, one member for a term of three years, and two
- 38 members for a term of four years.
- 39 4. The public member shall, at the time of his or her
- 40 appointment, be a citizen of the United States, a resident
- 41 of this state for a period of one year, and a registered
- 42 voter. The public member shall not be a person who is or
- 43 ever was a member of any profession licensed or regulated
- 44 pursuant to this chapter or the spouse of such person, and
- 45 shall not be a person who has or has ever had a material
- 46 financial interest in providing for the professional
- 47 services regulated by this chapter, or an activity or
- 48 organization directly related to any profession licensed or
- 49 regulated pursuant to this chapter. The duties of the
- 50 public member shall not include the determination of
- 51 technical requirements for licensure or whether any person
- 52 meets such technical requirements or of the technical
- 53 competence or judgment of a licensee or candidate.
- 5. All members, including public members, shall be
- 55 chosen from a list submitted by the director of the
- 56 department.
 - 334.1059. 1. The board shall:

- 2 (1) Adopt rules that are necessary or proper for the administration of sections 334.1051 to 334.1084;
- 4 (2) Administer and enforce all provisions of sections
- 5 334.1051 to 334.1084 and all rules adopted by the board
- 6 pursuant to the authority granted in sections 334.1051 to
- 7 334.1084;
- 8 (3) Set the amount of the fees which sections 334.1051
- 9 to 334.1084 authorizes and requires by rules and regulations
- 10 promulgated pursuant to section 536.021. The fees shall be
- 11 set at a level to produce revenue, which shall not
- 12 substantially exceed the cost and expense of administering
- 13 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084;
- 14 (4) Deposit all funds received pursuant to sections
- 15 334.1051 to 334.1084 in the fund established in section
- 16 334.050; and
- 17 (5) Adopt rules for conducting licensing examinations
- 18 required by sections 334.1051 to 334.1084.
- 19 2. The board may:
- 20 (1) Adopt rules that prescribe continuing medical
- 21 education for the renewal of licenses issued pursuant to
- 22 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084; and
- 23 (2) Employ permanent or temporary personnel it deems
- 24 necessary to carry out the purposes of sections 334.1051 to
- 25 334.1084 and designate their duties.
- 26 3. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is
- 27 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the
- 28 authority delegated in sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 shall
- 29 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to
- 30 all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable,
- 31 section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are
- 32 nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the
- 33 general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay

34 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are

- 35 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of
- 36 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after
- 37 August 28, 2022, shall be invalid and void.
- 334.1062. 1. A person who holds a license pursuant to
- 2 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 shall display such document in
- 3 a conspicuous place that is accessible to view by the public.
- 4 2. A person who practices, conducts affairs, or is
- 5 employed at more than one location and who maintains a
- 6 continuing activity as authorized by the license shall
- 7 display a duplicate of such document issued by the board at
- 8 each location.
 - 334.1065. 1. All persons desiring to practice as a
- 2 naturopathic practitioner in this state shall be examined as
- 3 to their fitness to engage in such practice by the board.
- 4 All persons applying for examination shall file an
- 5 application with the board at least thirty days before the
- 6 date set for the examination upon applications furnished by
- 7 the board.
- 8 2. The examination required for a license pursuant to
- 9 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 shall be the naturopathic
- 10 physician's licensing examination (NPLEX), its successor
- 11 examination or equivalent, as determined by the board.
- 12 3. Upon the applicant paying a fee equivalent to the
- 13 required examination fee and furnishing the board with all
- 14 locations of previous practice and licensure in
- 15 chronological order, the board shall, pursuant to
- 16 regulations prescribed by it, admit without examination
- 17 qualified persons who meet the requirements of sections
- 18 334.1051 to 334.1084, and who hold certificates of licensure
- 19 to practice naturopathic medicine in any state or territory
- 20 of the United States or the District of Columbia. Within

21 the limits of this subsection, the board is authorized and

- 22 empowered to negotiate reciprocal compacts with licensing
- 23 boards of other states for admission of licensed
- 24 practitioners from Missouri in other states.
 - 334.1068. Sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 shall not
- 2 apply to the following persons:
- 3 (1) Any naturopathic practitioner who is employed as a
- 4 resident in a public hospital, provided such practice is
- 5 limited to such hospital and is under the supervision of a
- 6 licensed naturopathic practitioner;
- 7 (2) Any naturopathic practitioner who is licensed in
- 8 another state or country and who is meeting a naturopathic
- 9 practitioner licensed in this state, for purposes of
- 10 consultation, provided such practice is limited to such
- 11 consultation;
- 12 (3) Any naturopathic practitioner who is licensed in
- 13 another state or country and who is visiting a naturopathic
- 14 or other medical school or teaching hospital in this state
- 15 to conduct naturopathic instruction for a period not to
- 16 exceed six months, provided such practice is limited to such
- 17 instruction and is under the supervision of a licensed
- 18 naturopathic practitioner pursuant to sections 334.1051 to
- 19 334.1084;
- 20 (4) Any naturopathic student who is performing a
- 21 clinical clerkship or similar function in a hospital and who
- 22 is matriculated in a naturopathic school that meets
- 23 standards satisfactory to the department, provided such
- 24 practice is limited to such clerkship or similar function in
- 25 such hospital;
- 26 (5) A person engaged in the sale of vitamins, health
- 27 foods, dietary supplements, herbs, or other products of
- 28 nature the sale of which is not otherwise prohibited under

- 29 state or federal law. Nothing in this section allows such
- 30 person to hold himself or herself out as a naturopathic
- 31 practitioner; and
- 32 (6) Any other person licensed in this state in any
- 33 health care profession while the person is practicing within
- 34 the scope of the license.
 - 334.1071. 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of
- 2 sections 334.1059 to 334.1062, a person may be licensed as a
- 3 naturopathic practitioner without meeting the requirements
- 4 of section 334.1059 if the applicant:
- 5 (1) Is a resident of this state;
- 6 (2) Is at least twenty-one years of age;
- 7 (3) Provides proof acceptable to the board, as
- 8 established by rule of the board, that the person has been
- 9 actively engaged in naturopathic health care and has held
- 10 the person out to the public as qualified to practice
- 11 naturopathy for at least eighteen of the last twenty years
- 12 before August 28, 2022;
- 13 (4) Derives the majority of the person's income from
- 14 the practice of naturopathic medicine; and
- 15 (5) Applies for a license pursuant to this section
- 16 before July 1, 2024.
- 17 2. The board by rule may provide for limitations on
- 18 the practice of a person licensed pursuant to subsection 1
- 19 of this section. The board may require a person licensed
- 20 pursuant to this section to be identified as a person whose
- 21 practice is limited.
- 3. A person licensed pursuant to this section may:
- 23 (1) Use the title naturopathic practitioner and any
- other title allowed pursuant to sections 334.1051 to
- 25 **334.1084**; and

- 26 (2) Practice naturopathy only within the scope of
- 27 practice that reflects the limits of the person's training
- 28 and experience.
 - 334.1074. Any person who violates any provision of
- 2 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 is guilty of a class A
- 3 misdemeanor.
- 334.1077. The board shall not renew any license unless
- 2 the licensee provides satisfactory evidence that the
- 3 licensee has complied with the board's minimum requirements
- 4 for continuing education. All persons once licensed to
- 5 practice naturopathic medicine in this state shall, on or
- 6 before the license renewal date, furnish to the board
- 7 satisfactory evidence of completion of the requisite number
- 8 of hours of postsecondary study, which shall be twenty-four
- 9 hours during each twelve months of the registration period
- 10 immediately preceding the filing of the registration renewal
- 11 application. The postgraduate study required shall be from
- 12 a board-approved continuing education program.
 - 334.1080. 1. Every person licensed pursuant to the
- 2 provisions of sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 shall renew his
- 3 or her application on or before the registration renewal
- 4 date. The application shall be made under oath on a form
- 5 furnished by the board. The application shall include, but
- 6 not be limited to, disclosure of the following:
- 7 (1) The applicant's full name, the applicant's office
- 8 and residence address, and the date and number of his or her
- 9 license;
- 10 (2) All final disciplinary actions taken against the
- 11 applicant; and
- 12 (3) Information concerning the applicant's current
- 13 physical and mental fitness to practice as a naturopathic
- 14 practitioner.

- 2. A blank form for application for registration shall be mailed to each person licensed in this state at the person's last known office or residence address. The failure to receive such form shall not, however, relieve any person of the duty to register and pay the fee required by this chapter nor exempt him or her from the penalties provided by sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 for failure to
- 3. If a person licensed by the board does not renew
 such license by the license expiration date, such license
 shall be deemed void. If such person's license is deemed
 void, he or she may apply for a reinstatement of such
 license pursuant to the procedures established by the board.
- license pursuant to the procedures established by the board. Each applicant for license pursuant to 1. 2 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 shall accompany the application for license with a license fee to be paid to the 3 4 director of revenue. If the application is filed and the fee paid after the license renewal date, a delinquent fee 5 6 shall be paid; but whenever, in the opinion of the board, 7 the applicant's failure to register is caused by extenuating 8 circumstances, including illness of the applicant, as 9 defined by rule, the delinquent fee may be waived by the 10 Whenever any new license is granted to any person 11 pursuant to the provisions of sections 334.1051 to 334.1084, 12 the board shall, upon application, issue to such licensee a 13 license covering a period from the date of the issuance of 14 the license to the next renewal date without the payment of 15 any registration fee.
 - 2. The board shall set the amount of the fees which sections 334.1051 to 334.1084 authorizes and requires by rules promulgated pursuant to chapter 536. The fees shall be set at a level to produce revenue that shall not

- 20 substantially exceed the cost and expense of administering
- 21 sections 334.1051 to 334.1084.
 - 334.1084. The board shall adopt a naturopathic
- 2 formulary that lists the drugs and substances approved for
- 3 intramuscular or intravenous administration by a
- 4 naturopathic practitioner under the order of a physician.
- 5 The board shall appoint a naturopathic formulary advisory
- 6 committee, which shall advise the board and make
- 7 recommendations on the list of substances that may be
- 8 included in the naturopathic formulary. In no event shall
- 9 the formulary include any controlled substance listed in
- 10 chapter 195. The naturopathic formulary advisory committee
- 11 shall consist of a licensed pharmacist, a person
- 12 knowledgeable in medicinal plant chemistry, two persons
- 13 licensed to practice medicine and surgery, and two
- 14 naturopathic practitioners licensed under sections 334.1051
- 15 to **334.1084**.

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
