ANACT

To repeal sections 192.006 and 192.020, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the rulemaking authority of the department of health and senior services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 192.006 and 192.020, RSMo, are 2 repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be 3 known as sections 192.006 and 192.020, to read as follows: 192.006. The department of health and senior services 2 may adopt, appeal and amend rules necessary to carry out the 3 duties assigned to it. All rules shall be promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this section and chapter 536. 4 5 No rule or portion of a rule promulgated under the authority 6 of this chapter shall become effective unless it has been 7 promulgated pursuant to the provisions of section 536.024. 8 No rule promulgated by the department shall delegate the 9 department's rulemaking authority to any official, agency, 10 or other department. No rule promulgated by the department shall grant rulemaking authority to a state or 11 administrative official. 12 192.020. 1. It shall be the general duty and responsibility of the department of health and senior 2 3 services to safeguard the health of the people in the state and all its subdivisions. 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7 dangerous in their nature and shall make and enforce adequate [orders, findings,] rules and regulations to 8 9 prevent the spread of such diseases and to determine the prevalence of such diseases within the state. It shall have 10 power and authority, with approval of the director of the 11 12 department, to [make such orders, findings,] promulgate rules and regulations as will prevent the entrance of 13 14 infectious, contagious and communicable diseases into the 15 state. No rule promulgated by the department shall delegate the department's rulemaking authority to any official, 16 agency, or other department. No rule promulgated by the 17 department shall grant rulemaking authority to a state or 18 administrative official. 19

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2. The department of health and senior services shall
include in its list of communicable or infectious diseases
which must be reported to the department methicillin resistant staphylococcus aureus (MRSA), carbapenem-resistant
enterobacteriaceae (CRE) as specified by the department, and
vancomycin-resistant enterococcus (VRE).

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
