AN ACT

To repeal sections 571.060 and 571.070, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to firearms, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 571.060 and 571.070, RSMo, are 2 repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be 3 known as sections 571.060 and 571.070, to read as follows: 571.060. 1. A person commits the offense of unlawful 2 transfer of weapons if he or she: Knowingly sells, leases, loans, gives away or 3 (1)4 delivers a firearm or ammunition for a firearm to any person who, under the provisions of section 571.070, is not 5 6 lawfully entitled to possess such; 7 (2) Knowingly sells, leases, loans, gives away or delivers a blackjack to a person less than eighteen years 8 9 old without the consent of the child's custodial parent or 10 guardian, or recklessly, as defined in section 562.016, sells, leases, loans, gives away or delivers any firearm to 11 a person less than eighteen years old without the consent of 12 the child's custodial parent or guardian; provided, that 13 this does not prohibit the delivery of such weapons to any 14 peace officer or member of the Armed Forces or National 15 Guard while performing his **or her** official duty; [or] 16 17 (3) Recklessly, as defined in section 562.016, sells, leases, loans, gives away or delivers a firearm or 18 19 ammunition for a firearm to a person who is intoxicated;

(4) Knowingly sells, leases, loans, gives away, or
delivers a firearm to any person whose name appears on the
Terrorist Screening Center's No Fly List; or

(5) Knowingly sells, leases, loans, gives away, or
delivers a firearm to any person who is a member of a group
of two or more individuals, regardless if organized, that
engages in or has a subgroup that engages in international
or domestic terrorism.

28 2. Unlawful transfer of weapons under subdivision (1)
29 of subsection 1 of this section is a class E felony;
30 unlawful transfer of weapons under subdivisions (2) [and],
31 (3), (4), and (5) of subsection 1 of this section is a class

33 3. For purposes of this section, "terrorism" means
 activities that:

(1) Involve a violent act or acts dangerous to human
life that violate the criminal laws of the United States or
a state thereof that would be a criminal violation if
committed within the jurisdiction of the United States or a

571.070. 1. A person commits the offense of unlawful
possession of a firearm if such person knowingly has any
firearm in his or her possession and:

4 (1) Such person has been convicted of a felony under5 the laws of this state, or of a crime under the laws of any

6 state or of the United States which, if committed within 7 this state, would be a felony; [or]

8 (2) Such person is a fugitive from justice, is habitually in an intoxicated or drugged condition, or is 9 10 currently adjudged mentally incompetent;

11 Such person's name appears on the Terrorist (3) 12 Screening Center's No Fly List; or

13 (4) Such person is a member of a group of two or more 14 individuals, regardless if organized, that engages in or has 15 a subgroup that engages in international or domestic terrorism. For purposes of this subdivision, "terrorism" 16 means activities that: 17

Involve a violent act or acts dangerous to human 18 (a) life that are a violation of the criminal laws of the United 19 20 States or a state thereof or that would be a criminal 21 violation if committed within the jurisdiction of the United 22 States or a state thereof; and

(b) Appear to be intended to:

a. Intimidate or coerce a civilian population;

25 Influence the policy of a government by b. intimidation or coercion; or 26

27 Affect the conduct of a government by mass c. destruction, assassination, or kidnapping. 28

29 2. Unlawful possession of a firearm is a class D felony, unless a person has been convicted of a dangerous 30 31 felony as defined in section 556.061, in which case it is a 32 class C felony.

The provisions of subdivision (1) of subsection 1 33 3. 34 of this section shall not apply to the possession of an antique firearm. 35
