AN ACT

To repeal sections 313.800 and 313.805, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to excursion gambling boat facilities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Sections 313.800 and 313.805, RSMo, are
- 2 repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be
- 3 known as sections 313.800 and 313.805, to read as follows:
 - 313.800. 1. As used in sections 313.800 to 313.850,
- 2 unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following
- 3 terms mean:
- 4 (1) "Adjusted gross receipts", the gross receipts from
- 5 licensed gambling games and devices less winnings paid to
- 6 wagerers;
- 7 (2) "Applicant", any person applying for a license
- 8 authorized under the provisions of sections 313.800 to
- 9 313.850;
- 10 (3) "Bank", the elevations of ground which confine the
- 11 waters of the Mississippi or Missouri Rivers at the ordinary
- 12 high water mark as defined by common law;
- 13 (4) "Capital, cultural, and special law enforcement
- 14 purpose expenditures" shall include any disbursement,
- 15 including disbursements for principal, interest, and costs
- 16 of issuance and trustee administration related to any
- 17 indebtedness, for the acquisition of land, land
- 18 improvements, buildings and building improvements, vehicles,

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19 machinery, equipment, works of art, intersections, signing, 20 signalization, parking lot, bus stop, station, garage, 21 terminal, hanger, shelter, dock, wharf, rest area, river port, airport, light rail, railroad, other mass transit, 22 23 pedestrian shopping malls and plazas, parks, lawns, trees, 24 and other landscape, convention center, roads, traffic control devices, sidewalks, alleys, ramps, tunnels, 25 26 overpasses and underpasses, utilities, streetscape, lighting, trash receptacles, marquees, paintings, murals, 27 28 fountains, sculptures, water and sewer systems, dams, drainage systems, creek bank restoration, any asset with a 29 useful life greater than one year, cultural events, and any 30 expenditure related to a law enforcement officer deployed as 31 horse-mounted patrol, school resource or drug awareness 32 resistance education (D.A.R.E) officer; 33 (5) "Cheat", to alter the selection of criteria which 34 35 determine the result of a gambling game or the amount or 36 frequency of payment in a gambling game; 37 (6) "Commission", the Missouri gaming commission; "Credit instrument", a written check, negotiable 38 (7) instrument, automatic bank draft or other authorization from 39 a qualified person to an excursion gambling boat licensee or 40 any of its affiliated companies licensed by the commission 41 42 authorizing the licensee to withdraw the amount of credit extended by the licensee to such person from the qualified 43 44 person's banking account in an amount determined under section 313.817 on or after a date certain of not more than 45 thirty days from the date the credit was extended, and 46

includes any such writing taken in consolidation, redemption or payment of a previous credit instrument, but does not include any interest-bearing installment loan or other

50 extension of credit secured by collateral;

- 51 "Dock", the location in a city or county 52 authorized under subsection 10 of section 313.812 which 53 contains any natural or artificial space, inlet, hollow, or basin, in or adjacent to a bank of the Mississippi or 54 55 Missouri Rivers, next to a wharf or landing devoted to the embarking of passengers on and disembarking of passengers 56 from a gambling excursion but shall not include any 57 58 artificial space created after May 20, 1994, and is located more than one thousand feet from the closest edge of the 59 60 main channel of the river as established by the United States Army Corps of Engineers; 61 "Excursion gambling boat", a boat, ferry, other 62 (9)63 floating facility, or any nonfloating facility licensed by 64 the commission on or inside of which gambling games are allowed; 65 "Fiscal year", the fiscal year of a home dock 66 city or county; 67 "Floating facility", any facility built or 68 69 originally built as a boat, ferry or barge licensed by the commission on which gambling games are allowed; 70 71 "Gambling excursion", the time during which (12)72 gambling games may be operated on an excursion gambling boat whether docked or during a cruise; 73 74 "Gambling game" includes, but is not limited to, games of skill or games of chance on an excursion gambling 75 76 boat but does not include gambling on sporting events; 77 provided such games of chance are approved by amendment to 78 the Missouri Constitution; "Games of chance", any gambling game in which the 79
- player's expected return is not favorably increased by the player's reason, foresight, dexterity, sagacity, design, information or strategy;

(15) "Games of skill", any gambling game in which 83 there is an opportunity for the player to use the player's 84 85 reason, foresight, dexterity, sagacity, design, information or strategy to favorably increase the player's expected 86 return; including, but not limited to, the gambling games 87 known as "poker", "blackjack" (twenty-one), "craps", 88 "Caribbean stud", "pai gow poker", "Texas hold'em", "double 89 90 down stud", and any video representation of such games; 91 "Gross receipts", the total sums wagered by (16)92 patrons of licensed gambling games; "Holder of occupational license", a person 93 licensed by the commission to perform an occupation within 94 95 excursion gambling boat operations which the commission has identified as requiring a license; 96 97 "Licensee", any person licensed under sections 313.800 to 313.850; 98 99 "Mississippi River" and "Missouri River", the water, bed and banks of those rivers, including any space 100 101 filled wholly or partially by the water of those rivers in a manner approved by the commission but shall not include any 102 artificial space created after May 20, 1994, and is located 103 more than one thousand feet from the closest edge of the 104 main channel of the river as established by the United 105 106 States Army Corps of Engineers; 107 "Nonfloating facility", any structure within one thousand feet from the closest edge of the main channel of 108 109 the Missouri or Mississippi River, as established by the 110 United States Army Corps of Engineers, that contains at least two thousand gallons of water beneath or inside the 111 112 facility either by an enclosed space containing such water 113 or in rigid or semirigid storage containers, tanks, or 114 structures;

115 (21) "Supplier", a person who sells or leases gambling 116 equipment and gambling supplies to any licensee.

117 2. (1) In addition to the games of skill defined in

118 this section, the commission may approve other games of

119 skill upon receiving a petition requesting approval of a

120 gambling game from any applicant or licensee. The

121 commission may set the matter for hearing by serving the

122 applicant or licensee with written notice of the time and

123 place of the hearing not less than five days prior to the

124 date of the hearing and posting a public notice at each

125 commission office. The commission shall require the

126 applicant or licensee to pay the cost of placing a notice in

127 a newspaper of general circulation in the applicant's or

128 licensee's home dock city or county. The burden of proof

that the gambling game is a game of skill is at all times on

130 the petitioner. The petitioner shall have the affirmative

131 responsibility of establishing the petitioner's case by a

132 preponderance of evidence including:

133 (a) Is it in the best interest of gaming to allow the 134 game; and

135 (b) Is the gambling game a game of chance or a game of 136 skill?

137 (2) All testimony shall be given under oath or
138 affirmation. Any citizen of this state shall have the
139 opportunity to testify on the merits of the petition. The
140 commission may subpoena witnesses to offer expert
141 testimony. Upon conclusion of the hearing, the commission

testimony. Opon conclusion of the hearing, the commission

shall evaluate the record of the hearing and issue written

143 findings of fact that shall be based exclusively on the

144 evidence and on matters officially noticed. The commission

shall then render a written decision on the merits which

146 shall contain findings of fact, conclusions of law and a

147 final commission order. The final commission order shall be

- 148 within thirty days of the hearing. Copies of the final
- 149 commission order shall be served on the petitioner by
- 150 certified or overnight express mail, postage prepaid, or by
- 151 personal delivery.
 - 313.805. The commission shall have full jurisdiction
 - 2 over and shall supervise all gambling operations governed by
 - 3 sections 313.800 to 313.850. The commission shall have the
 - 4 following powers and shall promulgate rules and regulations
 - 5 to implement sections 313.800 to 313.850:
 - 6 (1) To investigate applicants and determine the
 - 7 priority and eligibility of applicants for a license and to
 - 8 select among competing applicants for a license the
 - 9 applicant which best serves the interests of the citizens of
- 10 Missouri;
- 11 (2) To license the operators of excursion gambling
- 12 boats and operators of gambling games within such boats, to
- 13 identify occupations within the excursion gambling boat
- 14 operations which require licensing, and adopt standards for
- 15 licensing the occupations including establishing fees for
- 16 the occupational licenses and to license suppliers;
- 17 (3) To adopt standards under which all excursion
- 18 gambling boat operations shall be held and standards for the
- 19 facilities within which the gambling operations are to be
- 20 held. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 311 to the
- 21 contrary, the commission may authorize the operation of
- 22 gambling games on an excursion gambling boat which is also
- 23 licensed to sell or serve alcoholic beverages, wine, or
- 24 beer. The commission shall regulate the wagering structure
- 25 for gambling excursions, provided that the commission shall
- 26 not establish any regulations or policies that limit the
- 27 amount of wagers, losses, or buy-in amounts;

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- 28 (4) To enter the premises of excursion gambling boats,
- 29 facilities, or other places of business of a licensee within
- 30 this state to determine compliance with sections 313.800 to
- 31 313.850;
- 32 (5) To investigate alleged violations of sections
- 33 313.800 to 313.850 or the commission rules, orders, or final
- 34 decisions;
- 35 (6) To assess any appropriate administrative penalty
- 36 against a licensee, including, but not limited to,
- 37 suspension, revocation, and penalties of an amount as
- 38 determined by the commission up to three times the highest
- 39 daily amount of gross receipts derived from wagering on the
- 40 gambling games, whether unauthorized or authorized,
- 41 conducted during the previous twelve months as well as
- 42 confiscation and forfeiture of all gambling game equipment
- 43 used in the conduct of unauthorized gambling games.
- 44 Forfeitures pursuant to this section shall be enforced as
- 45 provided in sections 513.600 to 513.645;
- 46 (7) To require a licensee, an employee of a licensee
- 47 or holder of an occupational license to remove a person
- 48 violating a provision of sections 313.800 to 313.850 or the
- 49 commission rules, orders, or final orders, or other person
- 50 deemed to be undesirable from the excursion gambling boat or
- 51 adjacent facilities;
- 52 (8) To require the removal from the premises of a
- 53 licensee, an employee of a licensee, or a holder of an
- 54 occupational license for a violation of sections 313.800 to
- 55 313.850 or a commission rule or engaging in a fraudulent
- 56 practice;
- 57 (9) To require all licensees to file all financial
- 58 reports required by rules and regulations of the commission;

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59 To issue subpoenas for the attendance of 60 witnesses and subpoenas duces tecum for the production of 61 books, records, and other pertinent documents, and to administer oaths and affirmations to the witnesses, when, in 62 the judgment of the commission, it is necessary to enforce 63 sections 313.800 to 313.850 or the commission rules; 64 65 To keep accurate and complete records of its 66 proceedings and to certify the records as may be appropriate; 67 (12) To ensure that the gambling games are conducted 68 fairly. No gambling device shall be set to pay out less than eighty percent of all wagers; 69 To require all licensees of gambling game 70 71 operations to use a cashless wagering system whereby all players' money is converted to physical or electronic 72 73 tokens, electronic cards, or chips which only can be used on 74 the excursion gambling boat; 75 To require excursion gambling boat licensees to 76 develop a system, approved by the commission, that allows 77 patrons the option to prohibit the excursion gambling boat licensee from using identifying information for marketing 78 79 purposes. The provisions of this subdivision shall apply 80 only to patrons giving identifying information for the first time. Such system shall be submitted to the commission by 81 82 October 1, 2000, and approved by the commission by January 1, 2001. The excursion gambling boat licensee shall use 83 84 identifying information obtained from patrons who have 85 elected to have marketing blocked under the provisions of this section only for the purposes of enforcing the 86 requirements contained in sections 313.800 to 313.850. 87 section shall not prohibit the commission from accessing 88 identifying information for the purposes of enforcing

section 313.004 and sections 313.800 to 313.850;

91 (15) To determine which of the authorized gambling 92 games will be permitted on any licensed excursion gambling 93 boat;

- excursion gambling boats on any of the following criteria: the docking location or the excursion cruise could cause danger to the boat's passengers, violate federal law or the law of another state, or cause disruption of interstate commerce or possible interference with railway or barge transportation. The commission shall consider economic feasibility or impact that would benefit land-based development and permanent job creation. The commission shall not discriminate among applicants for excursion gambling boats that are similarly situated with respect to the criteria set forth in this section;
- (17) The commission shall render a finding or findings concerning the transition from a boat, barge, or floating facility to a nonfloating facility within thirty days after a hearing on any request from an applicant or existing licensee. Such hearing may be held prior to any final action on licensing to assist an applicant and any city or county in the finalizing of their economic development plan;
- To require any applicant for a license or renewal of a license to operate an excursion gambling boat to provide an affirmative action plan which has as its goal the use of best efforts to achieve maximum employment of African-Americans and other minorities and maximum participation in the procurement of contractual purchases of goods and This provision shall be administered in accordance with all federal and state employment laws, including Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended by the Civil Rights Act of 1991.
