AN ACT

To amend chapter 1, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to seizure of firearms.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 1, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 1.486, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 1.486. 1. This section shall be known and cited as
- 2 the "Anti-Red Flag Gun Seizure Act".
- Any federal order of protection or other judicial
- 4 order issued by a court to confiscate any firearm, firearm
- 5 accessory, or ammunition from any law-abiding citizen shall
- 6 be considered an infringement on the people's right to keep
- 7 and bear arms, as quaranteed by Amendment II of the
- 8 Constitution of the United States and Article I, Section 23
- 9 of the Constitution of Missouri, within the borders of this
- 10 state.
- 3. No entity or person, including any public officer,
- 12 agency, or employee of this state or any political
- 13 subdivision of this state, shall have the authority to
- 14 enforce or attempt to enforce any federal acts, laws,
- 15 executive orders, administrative orders, rules, regulations,
- 16 statutes, or ordinances infringing on the right to keep and
- 17 bear arms as described under section 1.420. Nothing in
- 18 sections 1.410 to 1.486 shall be construed to prohibit

Missouri officials from accepting aid from federal officials in an effort to enforce Missouri laws.

- 4. No public agency, political subdivision, or law
 enforcement agency shall receive any federal funding for the
 purpose of enforcing any federal acts, laws, executive
 orders, administrative orders, rules, regulations, statutes,
 or ordinances relating to the confiscation of firearms,
 firearm accessories, or ammunition.
- 5. No public agency, political subdivision, or law
 enforcement agency shall receive any federal funding for the
 purposes of enforcing any order of protection issued by a
 court to confiscate any firearms, firearm accessories, or
 ammunition.
