As used in sections 301.141 to 301.143, 4 5 the following terms mean: "Department", the department of revenue; 6 7 (2) "Director", the director of the department of 8 revenue; 9 (3) "Other authorized health care practitioner" includes advanced practice registered nurses licensed 10 pursuant to chapter 335, physician assistants licensed 11 12 pursuant to chapter 334, chiropractors licensed pursuant to 13 chapter 331, podiatrists licensed pursuant to chapter 330, assistant physicians, physical therapists licensed pursuant 14 15 to chapter 334, and optometrists licensed pursuant to 16 chapter 336; (4) "Physically disabled", a natural person who is 17 blind, as defined in section 8.700, or a natural person with 18 medical disabilities which prohibits, limits, or severely 19 20 impairs one's ability to ambulate or walk, as determined by 21 a licensed physician or other authorized health care practitioner as follows: 22 The person cannot ambulate or walk fifty or less 23 feet without stopping to rest due to a severe and disabling 24 arthritic, neurological, orthopedic condition, or other 25 severe and disabling condition; or 26

- 27 (b) The person cannot ambulate or walk without the use 28 of, or assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch, another 29 person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive
- 30 device; or
- 31 (c) Is restricted by a respiratory or other disease to
- 32 such an extent that the person's forced respiratory
- 33 expiratory volume for one second, when measured by
- 34 spirometry, is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen
- 35 tension is less than sixty mm/hg on room air at rest; or
- 36 (d) Uses portable oxygen; or
- 37 (e) Has a cardiac condition to the extent that the
- 38 person's functional limitations are classified in severity
- 39 as class III or class IV according to standards set by the
- 40 American Heart Association; or
- 41 (f) Except as otherwise provided in subdivision (4) of
- 42 subsection 16 of this section, a person's age, in and of
- 43 itself, shall not be a factor in determining whether such
- 44 person is physically disabled or is otherwise entitled to
- 45 disabled license plates and/or disabled windshield hanging
- 46 placards within the meaning of sections 301.141 to 301.143;
- 47 (5) "Physician", a person licensed to practice
- 48 medicine pursuant to chapter 334;
- 49 (6) "Physician's statement", a statement personally
- 50 signed by a duly authorized person which certifies that a
- 51 person is disabled as defined in this section;
- 52 (7) "Temporarily disabled person", a disabled person
- 53 as defined in this section whose disability or incapacity is
- 54 expected to last no more than one hundred eighty days;
- 55 (8) "Temporary windshield placard", a placard to be
- 56 issued to persons who are temporarily disabled persons as
- 57 defined in this section, certification of which shall be
- indicated on the physician's statement;

- (9) "Windshield placard", a placard to be issued to persons who are physically disabled as defined in this section, certification of which shall be indicated on the physician's statement.
- 2. Other authorized health care practitioners may
 furnish to a disabled or temporarily disabled person a
 physician's statement for only those physical health care
 conditions for which such health care practitioner is
 legally authorized to diagnose and treat.
- 3. A physician's statement shall:

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- 69 (1) Be on a form prescribed by the director of revenue;
- 70 (2) Set forth the specific diagnosis and medical 71 condition which renders the person physically disabled or 72 temporarily disabled as defined in this section;
- 73 (3) Include the physician's or other authorized health74 care practitioner's license number; and
- 75 (4) Be personally signed by the issuing physician or 76 other authorized health care practitioner.
- 77 If it is the professional opinion of the physician or other authorized health care practitioner issuing the 78 79 statement that the physical disability of the applicant, 80 user, or member of the applicant's household is permanent, it shall be noted on the statement. Otherwise, the 81 82 physician or other authorized health care practitioner shall note on the statement the anticipated length of the 83 84 disability, which shall determine the expiration date for the temporary windshield placard, and which period [may] 85 shall not exceed one hundred eighty days. If the physician 86 or health care practitioner fails to record an expiration 87 88 date on the physician's statement, the director shall issue
 - 5. A physician or other authorized health care practitioner who issues or signs a physician's statement so

a temporary windshield placard for a period of thirty days.

- 7. Owners of motor vehicles who are residents of the
- 109 state of Missouri, and who are physically disabled, owners
- 110 of motor vehicles operated at least fifty percent of the
- 111 time by a physically disabled person, or owners of motor
- vehicles used to primarily transport physically disabled
- 113 members of the owner's household may obtain disabled person
- 114 license plates. Such owners, upon application[,] to the
- 115 director accompanied by the documents and fees provided for
- in this section, a current physician's statement which has
- 117 been issued within ninety days proceeding the date the
- 118 application is made, and proof of compliance with the state
- 119 motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of
- 120 motor vehicles, shall be issued motor vehicle license plates
- 121 for vehicles, other than commercial vehicles with a gross
- 122 weight in excess of twenty-four thousand pounds, upon which
- 123 shall be inscribed the international wheelchair
- 124 accessibility symbol and the word "DISABLED" in addition to

- 125 a combination of letters and numbers. Such license plates 126 shall be made with fully reflective material with a common 127 color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by 128 129 section 301.130. If at any time an individual who obtained 130 disabled license plates issued under this subsection no 131 longer occupies a residence with a physically disabled 132 person, or no longer owns a vehicle that is operated at 133 least fifty percent of the time by a physically disabled
- person, such individual shall surrender the disabled license plates to the department within thirty days of becoming ineligible for their use.
- 137 The director shall further issue, upon request, to 138 such applicant one, and for good cause shown, as the 139 director may define by rule and regulations, not more than 140 two, removable disabled windshield hanging placards for use 141 when the disabled person is occupying a vehicle or when a vehicle not bearing the permanent handicap plate is being 142 used to pick up, deliver, or collect the physically disabled 143 person issued the disabled motor vehicle license plate or 144 disabled windshield hanging placard. 145
- 9. No additional fee shall be paid to the director for 146 the issuance of the special license plates provided in this 147 148 section, except for special personalized license plates and 149 other license plates described in this subsection. Priority 150 for any specific set of special license plates shall be 151 given to the applicant who received the number in the immediately preceding license period subject to the 152 applicant's compliance with the provisions of this section 153 154 and any applicable rules or regulations issued by the 155 director. If determined feasible by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, any special license plate 156 157 issued pursuant to this section may be adapted to also

- include the international wheelchair accessibility symbol
 and the word "DISABLED" as prescribed in this section and
 such plate may be issued to any applicant who meets the
 requirements of this section and the other appropriate
 provision of this chapter, subject to the requirements and
 fees of the appropriate provision of this chapter.
- 10. Any physically disabled person, or the parent or 164 quardian of any such person, or any not-for-profit group, 165 organization, or other entity which transports more than one 166 167 physically disabled person, may apply to the director of 168 revenue for a removable windshield placard. The placard may 169 be used in motor vehicles which do not bear the permanent 170 handicap symbol on the license plate. Such placards must be 171 hung from the front, middle rearview mirror of a parked 172 motor vehicle and may not be hung from the mirror during 173 operation. These placards may only be used during the 174 period of time when the vehicle is being used by a disabled person, or when the vehicle is being used to pick up, 175 176 deliver, or collect a disabled person, and shall be surrendered to the department, within thirty days, if a 177 group, organization, or entity that obtained the removable 178 179 windshield placard due to the transportation of more than 180 one physically disabled person no longer transports more 181 than one disabled person. When there is no rearview mirror, the placard shall be displayed on the dashboard on the 182 driver's side. 183
- 184 11. The removable windshield placard shall conform to
 185 the specifications, in respect to size, color, and content,
 186 as set forth in federal regulations published by the
 187 Department of Transportation. The removable windshield
 188 placard shall be renewed every four years. The director may
 189 stagger the expiration dates to equalize workload or until
 190 the time of motor vehicle registration renewal for the

- convenience of the applicant. Only one removable placard
 may be issued to an applicant who has been issued disabled
 person license plates. Upon request, one additional
 windshield placard may be issued to an applicant who has not
 been issued disabled person license plates.
- 196 12. A temporary windshield placard shall be issued to any physically disabled person, or the parent or guardian of 197 198 any such person who otherwise qualifies except that the 199 physical disability, in the opinion of the physician, is not 200 expected to exceed a period of one hundred eighty days. 201 temporary windshield placard shall conform to the specifications, in respect to size, color, and content, as 202 203 set forth in federal regulations published by the Department 204 of Transportation. The fee for the temporary windshield 205 placard shall be two dollars. Upon request, and for good 206 cause shown, one additional temporary windshield placard may 207 be issued to an applicant. Temporary windshield placards shall be issued upon presentation of the physician's 208 209 statement provided by this section and shall be displayed in the same manner as removable windshield placards. A person 210 or entity shall be qualified to possess and display a 211 212 temporary removable windshield placard for six months and the placard may be renewed once for an additional six months 213 214 if a physician's statement pursuant to this section is 215 supplied to the director of revenue at the time of renewal.
- placards issued pursuant to this section shall be made to
 the director of revenue and shall be accompanied by a
 statement signed by a licensed physician or other authorized
 health care practitioner which certifies that the applicant,
- user, or member of the applicant's household is a physically
- disabled person as defined by this section.

- 223 The] A windshield placard shall be renewable only 224 by the person or entity to which the placard was originally 225 issued. Any placard issued pursuant to this section shall 226 only be used when the physically disabled occupant for whom 227 the disabled plate or placard was issued is in the motor 228 vehicle at the time of parking or when a physically disabled person is being delivered or collected. A disabled license 229 230 plate and/or a removable windshield hanging placard are not 231 transferable and may not be used by any other person whether 232 disabled or not.
- 233 [15.] 14. At the time the disabled plates or windshield hanging placards are issued, the director shall 234 issue a registration certificate which shall include the 235 236 applicant's name, address, and other identifying information 237 as prescribed by the director, or if issued to an agency, 238 such agency's name and address. This certificate shall 239 further contain the disabled license plate number or, for windshield hanging placards, the registration or identifying 240 241 number stamped on the placard. The validated registration receipt given to the applicant shall serve as the 242 registration certificate. 243

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- [16.] 15. The director shall, upon issuing any disabled registration certificate for license plates and/or windshield hanging placards, provide information which explains that such plates or windshield hanging placards are nontransferable, and the restrictions explaining who and when a person or vehicle which bears or has the disabled plates or windshield hanging placards may be used or be parked in a disabled reserved parking space, and the penalties prescribed for violations of the provisions of this act.
- 254 [17.] 16. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this
 255 subsection, every [new] applicant for issuance or renewal of

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     a disabled license plate or placard shall be required to
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     present a new physician's statement dated no more than
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     ninety days prior to such application. [Renewal applicants
     will be required to submit a physician's statement dated no
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     more than ninety days prior to such application upon their
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     first renewal occurring on or after August 1, 2005. Upon
     completing subsequent renewal applications, a physician's
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     statement dated no more than ninety days prior to such
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     application shall be required every eighth year. Such
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     physician's statement shall state the expiration date for
     the temporary windshield placard. If the physician fails to
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     record an expiration date on the physician's statement, the
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     director shall issue the temporary windshield placard for a
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     period of thirty days. The director may stagger the
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     requirement of a physician's statement on all renewals for

     contrary, if the applicant has presented proof of disability
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     in the form of a statement from the United States Veterans'

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     persons license plates or windshield placards. Initial
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     applications shall be accompanied by the physician's
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     statement required by this section.
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          (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (f) of
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     subdivision (4) of subsection 1 of this section, any person
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     seventy-five years of age or older who provided a
     physician's statement with the original application shall
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     not be required to provide a physician's statement for the
     purpose of renewal of disabled persons license plates or
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     windshield placards.
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288 (4) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the 289 contrary, if the applicant has presented a physician's 290 statement noting that the physical disability of the 291 applicant, user, or member of the applicant's household is 292 permanent, the applicant shall only be required to provide a 293 physician's statement for the purpose of renewal of disabled persons license plates or windshield placards every tenth 294 295 year. 296 [18.] 17. The director of revenue upon receiving a 297 physician's statement pursuant to this subsection shall 298 check with the state board of registration for the healing 299 arts created in section 334.120, or the Missouri state board 300 of nursing established in section 335.021, with respect to 301 physician's statements signed by advanced practice 302 registered nurses, or the Missouri state board of chiropractic examiners established in section 331.090, with 303 304 respect to physician's statements signed by licensed 305 chiropractors, or with the board of optometry established in 306 section 336.130, with respect to physician's statements signed by licensed optometrists, or the state board of 307 podiatric medicine created in section 330.100, with respect 308 309 to physician's statements signed by physicians of the foot or podiatrists to determine whether the physician is duly 310 311 licensed and registered pursuant to law. - 349 reciprocity agreements with other states or the federal
- 350 government for the purpose of recognizing disabled person
- 351 license plates or windshield placards issued to physically
- 352 disabled persons.

- 353 [23.] 22. When a person to whom disabled person 354 license plates or a removable or temporary windshield 355 placard or both have been issued dies, the personal 356 representative of the decedent or such other person who may come into or otherwise take possession of the disabled 357 358 license plates or disabled windshield placard shall return the same to the director of revenue under penalty of law. 359 360 Failure to return such plates or placards shall constitute a 361 class B misdemeanor.
- issued disabled person license plates or windshield placards to submit to an examination by a chiropractor, osteopath, or physician, or to such other investigation as will determine whether such person qualifies for the special plates or placards.
- [25.] 24. If such person refuses to submit or is found to no longer qualify for special plates or placards provided for in this section, the director of revenue shall collect the special plates or placards, and shall furnish license plates to replace the ones collected as provided by this chapter.
- [26.] 25. In the event a removable or temporary windshield placard is lost, stolen, or mutilated, the lawful holder thereof shall, within five days, file with the director of revenue an application and an affidavit stating such fact, in order to purchase a new placard. The fee for the replacement windshield placard shall be four dollars.
- [27.] 26. Fraudulent application, renewal, issuance, procurement or use of disabled person license plates or windshield placards shall be a class A misdemeanor. It is a class B misdemeanor for a physician, chiropractor, podiatrist or optometrist to certify that an individual or family member is qualified for a license plate or windshield

placard based on a disability, the diagnosis of which is

outside their scope of practice or if there is no basis for

the diagnosis."; and
