Amend SS/Senate Bill No. 862, Page 1, Section A, Line 3,

2 by inserting after all of said line the following:

3 "170.048. 1. By July 1, 2018, each district shall
4 adopt a policy for youth suicide awareness and prevention,
5 including plans for how the district will provide for the
6 training and education of its district employees.

7 2. Each district's policy shall address and include,
8 but not be limited to, the following:

9 (1) Strategies that can help identify students who are
10 at possible risk of suicide;

11 (2) Strategies and protocols for helping students at
12 possible risk of suicide; and

13 (3) Protocols for responding to a suicide death.

14 3. By July 1, 2017, the department of elementary and
15 secondary education shall develop a model policy that
16 districts may adopt. When developing the model policy, the
17 department shall cooperate, consult with, and seek input
18 from organizations that have expertise in youth suicide
19 awareness and prevention. By July 1, 2021, and at least
20 every three years thereafter, the department shall request
21 information and seek feedback from districts on their
22 experience with the policy for youth suicide awareness and
23 prevention. The department shall review this information
24 and may use it to adapt the department's model policy. The
25 department shall post any information on its website that it
26 has received from districts that it deems relevant. The

27 department shall not post any confidential information or
28 any information that personally identifies any student or
29 school employee.

30 4. (1) Beginning July 1, [2023] 2025, a public school
31 or charter school that serves any pupils in grades seven to
32 twelve and that issues pupil identification cards shall have
33 printed on either side of the cards:

34 (a) The three-digit dialing code that directs calls
35 and routes text messages to the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline,
36 988; and

37 (b) The nonemergency telephone number of the local
38 police department; and

39 (c) May have printed on either side of the cards:

40 a. The six-digit dialing code that routes text
41 messages to the Crisis Text Line, 741741; and

42 b. The telephone number of a local suicide prevention
43 hotline, if such hotline is available.

44 (2) If, on July 1, [2023] 2025, a public school or
45 charter school subject to the requirements of this
46 subsection has a supply of unissued pupil identification
47 cards that do not comply with the requirements of
48 subdivision (1) of this subsection, the school shall issue
49 those cards until that supply is depleted.

50 (3) Subdivision (1) of this subsection shall apply to
51 a pupil identification card issued for the first time to a
52 pupil and to a card issued to replace a damaged or lost card.

53 173.1200. 1. Each public institution of higher
54 education shall develop and implement a policy to advise
55 students and staff on suicide prevention programs available
56 on and off campus that includes, but is not limited to:

57 (1) Crisis intervention access, which includes
58 information for national, state, and local suicide
59 prevention hotlines;

60 (2) Mental health program access, which provides
61 information on the availability of local mental health
62 clinics, student health services, and counseling services;

63 (3) Multimedia application access, which includes
64 crisis hotline contact information, suicide warning signs,
65 resources offered, and free-of-cost applications;

66 (4) Student communication plans, which consist of
67 creating outreach plans regarding educational and outreach
68 activities on suicide prevention; and

69 (5) Post intervention plans, which include creating a
70 strategic plan to communicate effectively with students,
71 staff, and parents after the loss of a student to suicide.

72 2. Such policy shall also advise students, faculty,
73 and staff, including residence hall staff, of the proper
74 procedures for identifying and addressing the needs of
75 students exhibiting suicidal tendencies or behavior, and
76 shall provide for training, where appropriate.

77 3. Each public institution of higher education shall
78 provide all incoming students with information about
79 depression and suicide prevention resources available to
80 students. The information provided to students shall
81 include available mental health services and other support
82 services, including student-run organizations for
83 individuals at risk of or affected by suicide.

84 4. The information prescribed by subdivisions (1)
85 through (4) of subsection 1 of this section shall be posted
86 on the website of each institution of higher education in
87 this state.

88 5. Any applicable free-of-cost prevention materials or
89 programs shall be posted on the websites of the public
90 institutions of higher education and the department of
91 higher education and workforce development.

92 6. (1) Each public institution of higher education
93 shall establish and maintain methods of anonymous reporting
94 concerning unsafe, potentially harmful, dangerous, violent,
95 or criminal activities, or the threat of such activities.

96 (2) Such methods shall ensure that the identity of the
97 reporting party remains unknown to all persons and entities,
98 including law enforcement officers and employees or other
99 persons, except when criminal, civil, or administrative
100 action is initiated regarding unsafe, potentially harmful,
101 dangerous, violent, or criminal activities, or the threat of
102 such activities.

103 7. (1) Beginning July 1, [2023] 2025, a public
104 institution of higher education that issues student
105 identification cards shall have printed on either side of
106 the cards:

107 (a) The three-digit dialing code that directs calls
108 and routes text messages to the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline,
109 988; and

110 (b) The telephone number of the campus police or
111 security for the campus at which the student to whom the
112 card is issued regularly attends classes, or, if the campus
113 does not have campus police or security, the nonemergency
114 telephone number of the local police department; and

115 (c) May have printed on either side of the cards:

116 a. The six-digit dialing code that routes text
117 messages to the Crisis Text Line, 741741; and

118 b. The telephone number of a local suicide prevention
119 hotline, if such hotline is available.

120 (2) If, on July 1, [2023] 2025, a public institution
121 of higher education subject to the requirements of this
122 subsection has a supply of unissued student identification
123 cards that do not comply with the requirements of

124 subdivision (1) of this subsection, the institution shall
125 issue those cards until that supply is depleted.

126 (3) Subdivision (1) of this subsection shall apply to
127 a student identification card issued for the first time to a
128 student and to a card issued to replace a damaged or lost
129 card."; and
