## AN ACT

To repeal section 161.020, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to abolishing the department of elementary and secondary education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

The 20 commissioner of education shall appoint superintendents for 21 these schools and members of the advisory boards, provided 22 in chapter 178 and others.] The department of elementary and 23 secondary education is abolished, and its powers, duties, 24 personnel, and property shall be transferred as part of a 25 reorganization plan of the governor under sections 26.500 to 26 26.540 as provided in this section.

27 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the 28 contrary, the powers, duties, personnel, and property of the 29 divisions and offices of the department of elementary and 30 secondary education listed in subdivisions (1) through (10) 31 of this subsection shall be transferred as part of a 32 reorganization plan of the governor to the state agencies 33 and offices to be selected by the governor:

34 (1) Division of financial and administrative services; 35 (2) Division of learning services; 36 (3) Missouri schools for the severely disabled; Office of adult learning and rehabilitation; 37 (4) (5) Office of childhood; 38 (6) Office of college and career readiness; 39 40 (7) Office of data system management; Office of educator quality; 41 (8) 42 (9) Office of quality schools; and 43 (10) Office of special education. The state board of education shall continue to 44 3. select and appoint a commissioner of education as its chief 45 administrative officer, pursuant to section 2(b) of article 46

IX of the Missouri constitution. The commissioner of
education shall assist the state board of education, the
governor or the governor's designee, and the appropriate

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50 state agencies or offices with the implementation of the 51 transfers authorized by this section.

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4. Notwithstanding any provision of subsection 2 of 52 this section to the contrary, and subject to the approval of 53 both the governor and the state board of education, the 54 55 office of the commissioner of education shall retain or employ any administrative, communications, financial 56 services, governmental affairs, or legal staff members that 57 58 may be necessary to assist the state board of education, the governor or the governor's designee, and the appropriate 59 state agencies or offices with the implementation of the 60 provisions of this section. 61

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
