## **AN ACT**

To repeal sections 115.133, 115.155, and 115.161, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof five new sections relating to voting accessibility for persons with disabilities, with an effective date.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.133, 115.155, and 115.161, RSMo,

- 2 are repealed and five new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to
- 3 be known as sections 115.133, 115.134, 115.155, 115.161, and
- 4 115.226, to read as follows:
  - 115.133. 1. Except as provided in subsection 2 of
- 2 this section, any citizen of the United States who is a
- 3 resident of the state of Missouri and seventeen years and
- 4 six months of age or older shall be entitled to register and
- 5 to vote in any election which is held on or after his
- 6 eighteenth birthday.
- 7 2. No person who is adjudged incapacitated shall be
- 8 entitled to register or vote. No person shall be entitled
- 9 to vote:
- 10 (1) While confined under a sentence of imprisonment;
- 11 (2) While on probation or parole after conviction of a
- 12 felony, until finally discharged from such probation or
- 13 parole; or
- 14 (3) After conviction of a felony or misdemeanor
- 15 connected with the right of suffrage.
- 3. Except as provided in federal law or federal
- 17 elections and in section 115.277, no person shall be
- 18 entitled to vote if the person has not registered to vote in

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the jurisdiction of his or her residence prior to the deadline to register to vote.

4. A person with disabilities under a conservatorship or an incapacitated person under a guardianship may register to vote, provided a court order has not made findings of fact by clear and convincing evidence that the person cannot communicate, with or without reasonable accommodations, a desire to participate in the voting process pursuant to section 115.134 and the individual is not otherwise disqualified from voting.

A person is presumed competent to vote regardless of his or her quardianship or conservatorship 2 status. A person shall be deemed mentally incapacitated for 3 4 purposes of voting, if, during the course of any proceedings 5 establishing a quardian or conservator, the court finds by clear and convincing evidence that the person cannot 6 7 communicate, with or without reasonable accommodations, a desire to participate in the voting process, and a quardian 8 9 or conservator for the person or the person's estate is 10 appointed pursuant to chapter 475.

11 If an order establishing a guardianship or conservatorship is made and in connection with the order it 12 is found by clear and convincing evidence that the person 13 14 cannot communicate, with or without reasonable accommodations, a desire to participate in the voting 15 16 process, the court shall forward the order and determination 17 to the secretary of state and the election authority in the person's jurisdiction in the format prescribed by the 18 19 secretary of state.

115.155. 1. The election authority shall provide for the registration of each voter. Each application shall be in substantially the following form:

The options for political party affiliation 77 required by the application described in subsection 1 of 78 this section shall include all established political parties 79 and an option to be unaffiliated. If an applicant does not 80 designate an affiliation, the election authority shall mark 81 the applicant's form as unaffiliated.

- 3. After supplying all information necessary for the registration records, each applicant who appears in person before the election authority shall swear or affirm the statements on the registration application by signing his or her full name, witnessed by the signature of the election authority or such authority's deputy registration official. Each applicant who applies to register by mail pursuant to section 115.159, or pursuant to section 115.160 or 115.162, shall attest to the statements on the application by his or her signature.
- 4. Upon receipt by mail of a completed and signed voter registration application, a voter registration application forwarded by the division of motor vehicle and drivers licensing of the department of revenue pursuant to section 115.160, or a voter registration agency pursuant to section 115.162, the election authority shall, if satisfied that the applicant is entitled to register, transfer all data necessary for the registration records from the application to its registration system. Within seven business days after receiving the application, the election authority shall send the applicant a verification notice.

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103 If such notice is returned as undeliverable by the postal
104 service within the time established by the election
105 authority, the election authority shall not place the
106 applicant's name on the voter registration file.

- 5. If, upon receipt by mail of a voter registration application or a voter registration application forwarded pursuant to section 115.160 or 115.162, the election authority determines that the applicant is not entitled to register, such authority shall, within seven business days after receiving the application, so notify the applicant by mail and state the reason such authority has determined the applicant is not qualified. The applicant may file a complaint with the elections division of the secretary of state's office under and pursuant to section 115.219. If an applicant for voter registration fails to answer the question on the application concerning United States citizenship, the election authority shall notify the applicant of the failure and provide the applicant with an opportunity to complete the form in a timely manner to allow for the completion of the registration form before the next election.
- 124 6. The secretary of state shall prescribe

  125 specifications for voter registration documents so that they

  126 are uniform throughout the state of Missouri and comply with

  127 the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, including the

  128 reporting requirements, and so that registrations, name

  129 changes and transfers of registrations within the state may

  130 take place as allowed by law.
- 7. All voter registration applications shall be preserved in the office of the election authority.

- 8. A person with disabilities who is otherwise qualified to vote may complete a voter registration form with reasonable accommodations, as needed.

- 3 write, the election official shall fill in the registration
- 4 cards, and the applicant shall sign by mark, witnessed by
- 5 the election official. The election official shall note the

- 9 2. A person shall not be disqualified from voting due
- 10 to:
- 11 (1) Signing a voter registration form with a mark
- 12 pursuant to subsection 1 of this section;
- 13 (2) Completing a voter registration form with the
- 14 assistance of another person; or
- 15 (3) Completing a voter registration form with
- 16 reasonable accommodations pursuant to subsection 8 of
- 17 section 115.155.
  - 115.226. Each election authority shall ensure that
- 2 each polling place in its jurisdiction has a sufficient
- 3 number of voting systems that are accessible for individuals
- 4 with disabilities. Such systems shall be used for all
- 5 elections, including municipal elections, and shall comply
- 6 with the provisions of sections 115.225 to 115.273 as well
- 7 as Section 301 of the federal Help America Vote Act, 52
- 8 U.S.C.A. Section 21081.

Section B. Section A of this act shall become

2 effective on January 1, 2025.

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
