## AN ACT

To amend chapter 190, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to emergency medical services, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 190, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 190.177, to read as follows:

190.177. 1. The department of health and senior 2 services shall collaborate with the University of Missouri, 3 School of Medicine regarding the analysis of data collected 4 from ambulance services and emergency medical response 5 agencies pursuant to section 190.176. The provisions of 6 this section shall also apply to the collection, analysis, 7 and disclosure of emergency medical services data under 8 other provisions of state law.

9 2. The department and the university shall maintain 10 the confidentiality of all personal health information 11 abstracted by or reported to the department. Medical 12 information secured pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1 of this section shall be released by the department to the 13 university in accordance with formal agreements between the 14 15 department and the university. The university and the 16 department may share deidentified data with other public 17 health authorities, health researchers, local emergency 18 medical services agencies, regional emergency medical

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19 services advisory committees, emergency medical services 20 medical directors, and other research entities if such 21 persons and entities agree to abide by the personal health 22 information confidentiality requirements of state and 23 federal law.

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3. The department's collaboration with the university and utilization of emergency medical services data and other relevant data shall be for the purpose of quality improvement in the provision of emergency medical services, research, and reporting to regional emergency medical services advisory committees, state agencies, medical directors, and local emergency medical services agencies.

4. Local emergency medical services agencies shall be
provided with access, at no cost, to the data that the
agencies have submitted to the department and the university.

5. No individual or organization providing information to the department in accordance with this section shall be deemed to be or be held liable, either civilly or criminally, for divulging confidential information, unless such individual or organization acted in bad faith or with malicious purpose.

40 6. Any employee of the department, a public health 41 authority, the university, or other person with access to 42 the information collected pursuant to this section who 43 knowingly releases information in violation of the 44 provisions of this section shall be guilty of a class A 45 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished as 46 provided by law.

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
