## AN ACT

To amend chapter 161, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to a pilot program for media literacy and critical thinking.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Chapter 161, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2	one new section, to be known as section 161.355, to read as
3	follows:
	161.355. 1. This section shall be known and may be
2	cited as the "Media Literacy and Critical Thinking Act".
3	2. As used in this section, "media literacy" means the
4	following:
5	(1) An individual's ability to access, analyze,
6	evaluate, and participate with all forms of media, such as:
7	(a) News in print; and
8	(b) Social media content, such as images, text, video,
9	and other media content;
10	(2) An individual's ability to recognize bias and
11	stereotypes in media messages;
12	(3) The foundational skills of digital citizenship and
13	internet safety; and
14	(4) In the classroom, media literacy includes
15	integrating the process of critical analysis of media
16	messages into the daily classroom curricula.
17	3. The department of elementary and secondary
18	education shall establish the "Media Literacy and Critical

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19 Thinking" pilot program. Such pilot program shall be
20 implemented and administered during the 2025-26 and 2026-27
21 school years.

4. Under the media literacy and critical thinking
pilot program, the department of elementary and secondary
education shall select five to seven diverse school
districts to participate in the pilot program and from which
to study data related to the outcomes of the pilot program
in such school districts.

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5. A pilot program site shall:

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(1) Address each component of media literacy;

30 (2) Develop successful strategies for student learning
 31 within the daily classroom curricula in all grades or for a
 32 selected preschool to grade twelve level;

33 (3) Identify high-quality resources for such pilot
 34 program; and

35 (4) Demonstrate and report how such site addresses the
 36 following in the classroom:

37 (a) News content literacy, which is the ability to
38 access, analyze, evaluate, and distinguish verified
39 information from opinion and propaganda and the opportunity
40 to practice verification;

41 (b) Visual literacy, which is the ability to find,
42 interpret, and evaluate images and visual media such as
43 photographs, videos, illustrations, drawings, maps,
44 diagrams, and advertisements;

45 (c) Digital fluency, which is the ability to
46 understand and follow the norms of safe and responsible
47 technology use and how media influences attitudes and
48 behaviors; and

49 (d) Digital literacy, which is the ability to be
 50 technically fluent and able to make informed decisions about

51 content encountered online, recognize how networked 52 technology affects behavior and perception, and create and 53 effectively communicate with digital media tools.

54 6. The guidelines developed as a result of the study 55 of the information gained from the pilot program shall 56 provide students with the following information:

57 (1) The purpose and acceptable use of various social 58 media platforms;

59 (2) Social media behavior that ensures cyber safety,
60 cybersecurity, and cyber ethics;

(3) The potential negative consequences of failing to
use various social media platforms responsibly, such as
cyberbullying;

64 (4) The ability to access, analyze, evaluate, create,
 65 and act on all forms of digital and written communications;

66 (5) Digital ethics, etiquette, respectful discourse
67 with individuals who have differing opinions, safety,
68 security, digital footprints, and the identification of
69 rhetoric that incites violence;

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(6) Cyberbullying prevention and response;

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(7) The significance of algorithms;

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(8) Ways to identify online misinformation;

73 (9) A general knowledge of the economic structure of74 the digital landscape; and

(10) The importance of the right to freedom of speech
contained in the Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the
United States, including, but not limited to:

(a) The central role that the right to freedom of
speech has in the history of the United States; and

80 (b) The applicability of protections for freedom of
 81 speech for online interaction in school settings that the

department of elementary and secondary education shall
provide to school districts.

7. The guidelines developed as a result of the study of the information gained from the pilot program shall provide school districts with samples of learning activities, resources, and training that promote critical thinking and the skills necessary to evaluate all forms of media.

8. Before August 1, 2027, each pilot program site
shall submit a report to the department of elementary and
secondary education describing the implementation of and the
information gained from the pilot program.

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9. Before January 1, 2028, the department of
95 elementary and secondary education shall compile the reports
96 submitted from the pilot program sites and submit a summary
97 report to the general assembly containing at least the
98 following information:

99 (1) Qualitative and quantitative insights on how the100 pilot program sites addressed media literacy;

101 (2) A compendium of high-quality strategies and
 102 resources used by educators;

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(3) Any professional development used or required;

104 (4) Recommendations about which facilities,
105 instructional materials, and technologies are needed to
106 implement a media literacy and critical thinking program
107 statewide;

108 (5) Exploration of additional policy, administrative
 109 mechanisms, and legislative recommendations for implementing
 110 best practices and standards statewide; and

(6) A draft of proposed clear, inclusive media
literacy and critical thinking state standards for preschool
to grade twelve, compiled by drawing from key media literacy

skills and competencies in existing state standards and from the pilot program results.

116 10. Standards developed under this section shall be 117 included for consideration by the department of elementary 118 and secondary education during the state standards review 119 immediately following the termination of the pilot program.

11. The media literacy and critical thinking pilot
program shall terminate on June 30, 2027.

122 **12.** This section shall expire on December 31, 2027.

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
