AN ACT

To amend chapter 192, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to a dementia services coordinator.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 192, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 192.2155, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 192.2155. 1. The division of senior and disability
- 2 services within the department of health and senior services
- 3 shall establish a dementia services coordinator as a full-
- 4 time position.
- 5 2. The dementia services coordinator shall:
- 6 (1) Evaluate the coordination of dementia services
 7 within this state;
- 8 (2) Coordinate information resources affecting
- 9 Missourians living with dementia and their caregivers. Such
- 10 coordination shall include, but not be limited to:
- 11 (a) Using dementia-related data to coordinate ways to
- 12 improve public health outcomes and service delivery for
- 13 persons with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia;
- 14 (b) Establishing and maintaining relationships with
- 15 other agencies, providers, and organizations within the
- 16 state in order to meet the needs of affected populations and
- 17 prevent the duplication of services;

- 18 Supporting the provision of dementia-specific 19 staff training across all relevant state agencies, including 20 law enforcement, the department of health and senior 21 services, and other organizations; and
- Recommending strategies to improve coordination of 22 23 dementia-related services and resources provided by public 24 and private entities;
- 25 Streamline all applicable state government 26 services to increase efficiency and improve the quality of 27 care in residential, home-based, and community-based 28 settings;
 - (4) Identify any duplicated services;
- 30 (5) Identify grant opportunities to expand the scope 31 of services for persons living with dementia and their 32 caregivers and apply for the grant opportunities;
- (6) Complete other duties relevant to supporting 34 policy development and implementation to enhance the quality of life for persons affected by dementia and their 36 caregivers;
- (7) Promote public and professional awareness and 37 education of dementia and access to needed services and 38 39 programs; and
- 40 (8) Collect and monitor data concerning the impact of 41 dementia in Missouri.
