AN ACT

To repeal section 571.070, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to certain firearms with smart technology, with penalty provisions and an effective date for a certain section.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 571.070, RSMo, is repealed and two new

- 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
- 3 571.066 and 571.070, to read as follows:

571.066. Beginning on January 1, 2030, every handgun

- 2 sold in this state shall have smart gun technology. As used
- in this section and section 571.070, the term "handgun"
- 4 shall mean a firearm which has a short stock and is designed
- 5 to be held and fired by the use of a single hand and any
- 6 combination of parts from which such a firearm can be
- 7 assembled. As used in this section, the term "smart gun
- 8 technology" shall mean technology which limits persons that
- 9 may operate the handgun by means of fingerprint, facial
- 10 recognition, or other biometric factors where the technology
- 11 in the handgun cannot be connected to the internet or any
- 12 other electronic communication device besides the handgun.

571.070. 1. A person commits the offense of unlawful

- 2 possession of a firearm if such person knowingly has any
- 3 firearm in his or her possession and:
- 4 (1) Such person has been convicted of a felony under
- 5 the laws of this state, or of a crime under the laws of any

- 6 state or of the United States which, if committed within
- 7 this state, would be a felony; [or]
- 8 (2) Such person is a fugitive from justice, is
- 9 habitually in an intoxicated or drugged condition, or is
- 10 currently adjudged mentally incompetent; or
- 11 (3) Such person is in possession of a handgun in which
- 12 the smart gun technology does not allow the person to
- 13 operate the firearm.
- 14 2. Unlawful possession of a firearm is a class D
- 15 felony, unless a person has been convicted of a dangerous
- 16 felony as defined in section 556.061, in which case it is a
- 17 class C felony.
- 18 3. The provisions of subdivision (1) of subsection 1
- 19 of this section shall not apply to the possession of an
- 20 antique firearm.
 - Section B. The repeal and reenactment of section
- 2 571.070 of this act shall become effective on January 1,
- **3** 2031.
