JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment to article VI of the Constitution of Missouri, by adding thereto one new section relating to law enforcement agencies.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

	That at the next general election to be held in the

Using the Missouri uniform crime reporting system, the director of the Missouri department of public safety 14 15 shall annually determine the most dangerous cities in 16 Missouri. The director of the department of public safety shall develop a policing plan for the most dangerous cities 17 18 in Missouri which shall establishes a minimum number of 19 commissioned peace officers required to be on duty to 20 provide adequate protection for the citizens of that 21 municipality. The director of the department of public 22 safety shall provide the policing plan to the political 23 subdivision who shall implement its recommendations on 24 minimum policing levels within ninety days.

4. If a political subdivision refuses or fails to
enact the minimum policing levels within ninety days,
Missouri's attorney general may cause a petition to be filed
with the circuit court of the judicial circuit in which the
political subdivision is located seeking injunctive relief
or a declaratory judgment.

31 5. Any officer of the governing body of the political subdivision, or other persons whatsoever, who shall forcibly 32 resist or obstruct the execution or enforcement of any of 33 34 the minimum policing levels, or who shall delay or hinder, 35 shall be liable for a penalty of one thousand dollars for each and every offense. Any fines collected under this 36 section shall be placed in a fund established and maintained 37 by the Missouri state treasurer that shall go to providing 38 39 grants to organizations that support the families of fallen 40 police officers.

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
