2	by inserting after all of said line the following:
3	"361.909. Sections 361.900 to 361.1035 shall not apply
4	to:
5	(1) An operator of a payment system to the extent that
6	it provides processing, clearing, or settlement services
7	between or among persons exempted under this section or
8	licensees in connection with wire transfers, credit card
9	transactions, debit card transactions, stored value
10	transactions, automated clearinghouse transfers, or similar
11	funds transfers;
12	(2) A person appointed as an agent of a payee to
13	collect and process a payment from a payer to the payee for
14	goods or services, other than money transmission itself,
15	provided to the payer by the payee, provided that:
16	(a) There exists a written agreement between the payer
17	and the agent directing the agent to collect and process
18	payments from a payer on the payee's behalf;
19	(b) The payee holds the agent out to the public as
20	accepting payments for goods or services on the payee's
21	behalf; and
22	(c) Payment for the goods and services is treated as
23	received by the payee upon receipt by the agent so that the
24	payer's obligation is extinguished and there is no risk of
25	loss to the payer if the agent fails to remit the funds to
26	the payee;

- 27 (3) A person that acts as an intermediary by
  28 processing payments between an entity that has directly
  29 incurred an outstanding money transmission obligation to a
  30 sender and the sender's designated recipient, provided that
  31 the entity:
- 32 (a) Is properly licensed or exempt from licensing
  33 requirements under sections 361.900 to 361.1035;
- 34 (b) Provides a receipt, electronic record, or other 35 written confirmation to the sender identifying the entity as 36 the provider of money transmission in the transaction; and
- 37 (c) Bears sole responsibility to satisfy the
  38 outstanding money transmission obligation to the sender,
  39 including the obligation to make the sender whole in
  40 connection with any failure to transmit the funds to the
  41 sender's designated recipient;
- 42 (4) The United States or a department, agency, or 43 instrumentality thereof, or its agent;

- (5) Money transmission by the United States Postal Service or by an agent of the United States Postal Service;
- 46 (6) A state, county, city, or any other governmental 47 agency or governmental subdivision or instrumentality of a 48 state, or its agent;
- 49 (7) A federally insured depository financial 50 institution; bank holding company; office of an international banking corporation; foreign bank that 51 establishes a federal branch under the International Bank 52 Act, 12 U.S.C. Section 3102, as amended or recodified from 53 time to time; corporation organized under the Bank Service 54 Corporation Act, 12 U.S.C. Sections 1861-1867, as amended or 55 recodified from time to time; or corporation organized under 56 the Edge Act, 12 U.S.C. Sections 611-633, as amended or 57 recodified from time to time, under the laws of a state or 58 59 the United States:

- 60 (8) Electronic funds transfer of governmental benefits 61 for a federal, state, county, or governmental agency by a 62 contractor on behalf of the United States or a department, 63 agency, or instrumentality thereof, or on behalf of a state 64 or governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality 65 thereof;
- (9) A board of trade designated as a contract market under the federal Commodity Exchange Act, 7 U.S.C. Sections 1-25, as amended or recodified from time to time, or a person that, in the ordinary course of business, provides clearance and settlement services for a board of trade to the extent of its operation as or for such a board;
- 72 (10) A registered futures commission merchant under 73 the federal commodities laws to the extent of its operation 74 as such a merchant;

- (11) A person registered as a securities broker-dealer under federal or state securities laws to the extent of its operation as such a broker-dealer;
- 78 (12) An individual employed by a licensee, authorized 79 delegate, or any person exempted from the licensing 80 requirements under sections 361.900 to 361.1035 if acting 81 within the scope of employment and under the supervision of 82 the licensee, authorized delegate, or exempted person as an 83 employee and not as an independent contractor;
  - (13) A person expressly appointed as a third-party service provider to or agent of an entity exempt under subdivision (7) of this section solely to the extent that:
- 87 (a) Such service provider or agent is engaging in
  88 money transmission on behalf of and under a written
  89 agreement with the exempt entity that sets forth the
  90 specific functions that the service provider or agent is to
  91 perform; and

(b) The exempt entity assumes all risk of loss and all
legal responsibility for satisfying the outstanding money
transmission obligations owed to purchasers and holders of
the outstanding money transmission obligations upon receipt
of the purchaser's or holder's money or monetary value by
the service provider or agent;
(14) A person appointed as an agent of a payor for
purposes of providing payroll processing services for which
the agent would otherwise need to be licensed, provided all
of the following apply:
(a) There is a written agreement between the payor and
the agent that directs the agent to provide payroll
processing services on the payor's behalf;
(b) The payor holds the agent out to employees and
other payees as providing payroll processing services on the
<pre>payor's behalf;</pre>
(c) The payor's obligation to a payee, including an

employee or any other party entitled to receive funds via
