Amend SS/SCS/House Bill No. 147, Page 27, Section 70.748, Line 29,

by inserting after all of said line the following: 2 3 1. Upon recommendation of the chief of 4 police, the board may authorize and provide for the organization of a police reserve force composed of residents 5 of the city who qualify under the provisions of subsection 1 6 7 of section 84.570, however, in the interest of efficiency 8 and public safety, no person shall serve as a member of such 9 police reserve force following the last day of the month in which the person becomes sixty-five years of age. 10 reserve force shall be under the command of the chief of 11 police and shall be provided training, equipment, uniforms, 12 13 and arms as the chief shall direct with the approval of the board; and when assigned to active duty the members of the 14 15 reserve force shall possess all of the powers of regular 16 police officers and shall be subject to all laws and regulations applicable to police officers; provided, 17 however, that the city council or other governing body of 18 any such city may in its discretion fix a total in number 19 20 which the reserve force may not exceed. 21 In event of riot or other emergencies as declared and defined by the mayor, the city council or other 22 23 governing body in such city in concurrence with the board, 24 the board, upon recommendation of the chief, may appoint 25 special officers or patrolmen for temporary service in 26 addition to the police reserve force herein provided for,

- 27 but the length of time for which such officers or patrolmen
  28 shall be employed shall be limited to the time during which
  29 such emergency shall exist.
- 84.570. 1. No person shall be appointed policeman or 30 officer of police who shall have been convicted of any 31 32 offense, the punishment of which may be confinement in the 33 state penitentiary; nor shall any person be appointed who is 34 not proven to be of good character, or who is not proven to be a bona fide citizen of the United States, or who cannot 35 36 read and write the English language and who does not possess ordinary physical strength and courage, nor shall any person 37 be originally appointed to said police force who is less 38 39 than twenty-one years of age. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the board shall have the sole authority to 40 determine conditions of employment for police officers 41 pursuant to section 84.460. 42
- 2. In the interest of efficiency and public safety,
  law enforcement officers, as such term is defined in 29
  U.S.C. Section 630 or any successor statute, shall be
  separated from service on the last day of the month in which
  the employee becomes sixty-five years of age or reaches
  thirty-five years of creditable service, as such term is
  defined in section 86.900, whichever occurs later.

3. The board shall from time to time require open competitive examinations or tests for determining the qualifications and fitness of all applicants for appointment to positions on the police force. Such examinations and tests shall be practical and shall relate to matters which fairly measure the relative fitness of the candidates to discharge the duties of the positions to which they seek to be appointed. Notice of such examinations and tests shall be given not less than ten days in advance thereof by public advertisement in at least one newspaper of general

- 60 circulation in such city, and by posting notice in the
- 61 police headquarters building. A list of those qualifying in
- 62 such examinations shall be established, listing those
- 63 qualified in order of rank. When an appointment is to be
- 64 made, the appointment shall be made from such eligible list.
- 65 [3.] 4. The board shall also establish rules for:
- 66 (1) Temporary employment for not exceeding sixty days 67 in the absence of any eligible list;
- 68 (2) Hours of work of police employees and officers 69 subject to the provisions of section 84.510; and
- 70 (3) Attendance regulations and leaves of absence."; and 71 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
