AN ACT

To amend chapter 173, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the career-tech certificate program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 173, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 173.836, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 173.836. 1. This section shall be known and may be
- 2 cited as the "Career-Tech Certificate (CTC) Program".
- 3 2. As used in this section, the following terms mean:
- 4 (1) "Approved institution", an institution of
- 5 postsecondary education that is subject to the coordinating
- 6 board for higher education under section 173.005, offers
- 7 eligible programs of study or training programs, and is at
- 8 least one of the following:
- 9 (a) A public community college or vocational or
- 10 technical school as provided under subsection 8 of section
- 11 160.545;
- 12 (b) A two-year private vocational or technical school
- authorized to obtain reimbursements under subsection 8 of
- 14 section 160.545 as provided under subsection 10 of section
- **15** 160.545;
- 16 (c) An approved virtual institution, as defined in
- 17 section 173.1102; or
- 18 (d) An eligible training provider;
- 19 (2) "Department", the department of higher education
- 20 and workforce development;

- 62 3. (1) Beginning in the 2026-27 academic year and for
- 63 all subsequent academic years, the department shall, by
- 64 rule, establish a procedure for the reimbursement of the
- 65 costs of tuition, books, and fees from the career-tech
- 66 certificate (CTC) program fund to the approved institution
- at which an eligible student is enrolled in an eligible
- 68 program of study or a training program.
- 69 (2) No tuition reimbursements in excess of the tuition
- 70 rate charged by a public community college for coursework
- 71 offered by a two-year private vocational or technical
- 72 school, approved virtual institution as defined under
- 73 section 173.1102, or eligible training provider within the
- 74 service area of such college shall be reimbursed under this
- 75 section.
- 76 (3) (a) If a public community college or vocational
- or technical school offers the same or a substantially
- 78 similar eligible program of study or training program as a
- 79 private vocational or technical school, virtual institution,
- 80 or eligible training provider at which an eligible student
- 81 intends to enroll and the school or provider is located in
- 82 the service region of the public community college or
- 83 vocational or technical school that offers the same or
- 84 similar program of study or training program, no tuition
- 85 reimbursement shall be provided under this section for such
- 86 eligible student unless, before the eligible student enrolls:

- a. The private vocational or technical school, virtual
- 88 institution, or eligible training provider requests
- 89 authorization from the department for such tuition
- 90 reimbursement; and
- 91 b. The department authorizes such request.
- 92 (b) The department shall:
- a. Develop and adopt a tuition reimbursement
- 94 <u>authorization request form and a procedure for submitting</u>
- 95 such request;
- 96 b. Review and either authorize or deny such request
- 97 within twenty business days of receiving an accurate,
- 98 complete, and properly submitted request; and
- 99 c. If the department denies such request, provide the
- 100 educational entity and the eligible student with the reasons
- 101 for such denial.
- 102 (c) The department shall not deny a tuition
- 103 reimbursement authorization request without good cause, as
- 104 determined by the department on a case-by-case basis.
- 105 (4) The reimbursements provided under this section to
- 106 a two-year private vocational or technical school, approved
- 107 virtual institution as defined under section 173.1102, or
- 108 eligible training provider shall not violate the provisions
- of Article IX, Section 8, or Article I, Section 7, of the
- 110 Constitution of Missouri or the First Amendment to the
- 111 Constitution of the United States.
- 112 4. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury
- 113 the "Career-Tech Certificate (CTC) Program Fund", which
- 114 shall consist of any moneys appropriated annually by the
- 115 general assembly, gifts, bequests, grants, public or private
- 116 donations, or transfers. The state treasurer shall be
- 117 custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170
- and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements.
- 119 The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation,

- moneys in this fund shall be used solely for reimbursements
- 121 as provided in this section.
- 122 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080
- 123 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end
- of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
- 125 general revenue fund.
- 126 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the
- 127 fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any
- interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be
- 129 credited to the fund.
- 130 5. No rule promulgated by the department under this
- 131 section shall prohibit students enrolled in an eligible
- 132 program of study or a training program from qualifying for
- tuition reimbursement under this section solely because the
- eligible program of study or training program does not meet
- the length-of-program requirements for an eligible program
- under 34 CFR 668.8, as amended, or because the eligible
- 137 training provider at which a student enrolls does not
- 138 participate in federal student aid programs.
- 139 6. Eligibility for tuition, books, and fees
- 140 reimbursement to an approved institution as provided under
- 141 this section shall expire upon the earliest of:
- 142 (1) Receipt of the reimbursement for the required
- length for completion of such program as determined by the
- 144 department;
- 145 (2) A student's successful completion of an eligible
- 146 program of study or training program; or
- 147 (3) A student's completion of one hundred fifty
- 148 percent of the time usually required to complete an eligible
- 149 program of study or training program.
- The department may promulgate all necessary rules
- and regulations for the implementation and administration of
- 152 this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term

153	is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the
154	authority delegated in this section shall become effective
155	only if it complies with and is subject to all of the
156	provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section
157	536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and
158	if any of the powers vested with the general assembly
159	pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective
160	date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently
161	held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking
162	authority and any rule proposed or adopted after the
163	effective date of this act shall be invalid and void.
