AN ACT

To amend chapter 100, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to stadium financing.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 100, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2 two new sections, to be known as sections 100.243 and 100.245,
3 to read as follows:

100.243. 1. This section shall be known and may be
2 cited as the "No Taxation, All Donation Act".

3 The state of Missouri, acting through the
4 department and the office of administration, may, upon such
5 terms and with reasonable consideration as it may determine,
6 subject to appropriation, expend funds from the no taxation,
7 all donation fund for the purpose of aiding in the planning,
8 undertaking, financing, or carrying out of an athletic and
9 entertainment facility project for which application is made
10 to the department and approved by the director and the
11 commissioner.

12 Applicants shall submit an application to the
13 department containing all information required by the
14 department. The director and the commissioner shall review
15 the application for eligibility and may, in their
16 discretion, enter into an agreement as described in

17 subsection 2 of this section, provided the agreement meets
18 all other requirements of this section.

19 4. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury
20 the "No Taxation, All Donation Fund", which shall consist of
21 moneys received by private donation from any individual.
22 The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In
23 accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state
24 treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a
25 dedicated fund and money in the fund shall be used solely by
26 the department or the commissioner for the purposes of
27 aiding in the planning, undertaking, financing, or carrying
28 out of an athletic and entertainment facility project
29 pursuant to this section.

30 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080
31 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end
32 of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
33 general revenue fund.

34 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the
35 fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any
36 interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be
37 credited to the fund.

38 5. Any individual who donates more than ten thousand
39 dollars in the aggregate shall be entitled to free parking
40 at the facility that is funded, in whole or in part, by this
41 section.

42 6. As used in this section, the following terms shall
43 mean:

44 (1) "Athletic and entertainment facility", structures,
45 fixtures, systems, and facilities of sports and
46 entertainment venues with seating capacity of more than
47 thirty thousand, including associated parking facilities,
48 and that the director and commissioner determine is a

49 contributing factor in the attraction or retention of
50 sports, recreational, or entertainment activities, whether
51 professional, commercial, or private, and a primary factor
52 in the retention of a professional sports franchise in the
53 state. An athletic and entertainment facility may include a
54 professional sports franchise's headquarters facility and
55 training facility, regardless of whether they are co-located
56 in or adjacent to the stadium, but still located within the
57 state. Such structures, fixtures, systems, and facilities
58 may include, but are not limited to, foundations, roofs,
59 interior and exterior walls or windows, floors, steps,
60 stairs, concourses, hallways, restrooms, event or meeting
61 spaces or other hospitality-related areas, concession or
62 food preparation areas, or services systems such as
63 mechanical, gas utility, electrical, lighting,
64 communication, sound, sanitary, HVAC, elevator, escalator,
65 plumbing, sprinkler, cabling and wiring, life-safety
66 security cameras, access deterrents, public safety
67 improvements, or other building systems;

68 (2) "Commissioner", the commissioner of the office of
69 administration of the state of Missouri;

70 (3) "Department", the Missouri department of economic
71 development created by section 620.010;

72 (4) "Director", the director of the department of
73 economic development;

74 (5) "Professional sports franchise", any professional
75 sports team that is a member of Major League Baseball or the
76 National Football League;

77 (6) "Project", the development, construction,
78 reconstruction, rehabilitation, repair, or improvement of
79 any athletic and entertainment facility for which an
80 application is made and approved by the director and the

81 commissioner. A project must have total project costs of at
82 least five hundred million dollars to be eligible for
83 funding under this section. Residential, commercial,
84 retail, or mixed-use development adjacent to an athletic and
85 entertainment facility shall not be included as part of the
86 project.

100.245. 1. This section shall be known and may be
2 cited as the "No Dog in the Fight Act."

3 2. Any athletic and entertainment facility that is
4 funded, in whole or in part, through the no taxation, all
5 donation fund created pursuant to section 100.243, shall not
6 realize more than twenty percent in profits off of any food
7 sold on the premises of the facility.
