# **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 640, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to water resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 640, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 two new sections, to be known as sections 640.406 and 640.408,
- 3 to read as follows:
  - 640.406. 1. For the purposes of this section, the
- 2 following terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Applicant", any person applying for a water
- 4 exportation permit;
- 5 (2) "Beneficial uses", water uses, which include but
- 6 are not limited to domestic, agricultural, industrial,
- 7 recreational, and other legitimate beneficial uses;
- 8 (3) "Commission", the Missouri water resources
- 9 commission as established in section 640.408;
- 10 (4) "Department", the Missouri department of natural
- 11 resources;
- 12 (5) "Director", the director of the department of
- 13 natural resources;
- 14 (6) "End use", the final location for which the
- 15 exported water will be used, consumed, or applied for a
- 16 stated beneficial use:
- 17 (7) "Person", any individual, partnership,
- 18 copartnership, firm, company, public or private corporation,

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- 19 association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political
- 20 subdivision, water district, or any agency, board,
- 21 department, or bureau of the federal or any state
- 22 government, or any other legal entity which is recognized by
- 23 law as the subject of rights and duties;
- 24 (8) "Water exportation permit", a permit issued by the
- 25 department, approved by the commission, granting the
- 26 exportation of water outside the state of Missouri subject
- 27 to the provisions of this section;
- 28 (9) "Water resources", any Missouri water source
- 29 occurring on the surface, in natural or artificial channels,
- 30 lakes, reservoirs, or impoundments, and in subsurface
- 31 aquifers which are available or which may be made available.
- In order to protect the access, use, and enjoyment
- of Missouri's water resources, it shall be unlawful for any
- 34 person to export water resources outside the state of
- 35 Missouri unless such person holds a water exportation permit
- issued by the department, subject to the following
- 37 exemptions:
- 38 (1) If the withdrawal and end use of water resources
- 39 are within thirty miles of the border of the state, any
- 40 person exempt under the provision of this section shall
- 41 report to the director annually the person's water use
- 42 volumes and withdrawal rates in a format and timeline
- 43 determined by the director. Such report shall also be
- 44 provided to the commission; and
- 45 (2) Exportation of bottled water, or water packaged in
- 46 containers intended for single use.
- 47 3. The director shall review each water exportation
- 48 permit application and all supporting materials to ensure
- 49 all the following conditions have been met prior to

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50 accepting a water exportation permit application for public 51 comment and review by the commission:

- There are water resources available in the volumes and withdrawal rates requested by the applicant for export;
- 54 The applicant has demonstrated both a present need 55 and beneficial use for the water resources. In making the determination of need and beneficial use, the director shall 56 57 consider the availability of all water sources, whether in 58 state or out of state, along with other relevant factors as 59 the director and the commission deem appropriate;
- The volume and withdrawal rates requested by the (3) applicant shall not interfere with existing and projected instate beneficial uses; 62
  - The applicant has demonstrated that water in the amounts and rates requested can feasibly be exported to meet its intended beneficial uses;
  - The applicant has provided relevant information (5) and the director and the commission confirmed that issuance of a water exportation permit is necessary for the beneficial use of the applicant or the applicant's customers, and the beneficial use at the end use location is not reasonably attainable through a method other than granting a water exportation permit under this section;
  - In the event of a conflict between the beneficial use outside the state and the beneficial use needs in the state, the director and the commission shall prioritize the beneficial use needs of the state and its citizens over the applicant or other state; and
  - Whenever a person applies for a water exportation permit or water exportation permit renewal, the department of natural resources shall send a written notice within thirty business days after receiving the permit application

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to the county commission of the county where the water for exportation is located.

- Within one hundred twenty days after the receipt of a complete application, the director shall determine whether the applicant complied with provisions of subsection 3 of this section. The director shall, after making such determination, hold a thirty-day public comment period regarding the director's determination. Within sixty days after the comment period, the director shall recommend approval or denial of the permit. Such recommendation, along with all public comments, shall be submitted to the commission. The commission shall have a public hearing within thirty days after receipt of the director's recommendation. This public hearing may be scheduled during one of the commission's regular quarterly meetings. commission shall make a final decision to approve or deny the water exportation permit within thirty days after the public hearing. A three-fourths majority of the commission members present shall be required to approve the issuance or renewal of a water exportation permit.
  - applicant shall file a renewal application for a water exportation permit with the department no later than two hundred seventy-one days prior to the expiration of the existing water exportation permit. The applicant, director, and the commission shall follow the same procedures and timelines as required for the issuance of a new water exportation permit under this section. The director may impose additional conditions to address any substantial or material change in factors under subsection 3 of this section or may deny a renewal application as necessary to comply with this section based on any such substantial or

material changes in factors under subsection 3 of this
section. If the director or the commission are in the

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- 116 process of reviewing the renewal application before the
- 117 final decision is made and the existing applicant's water
- 118 exportation permit expires, such applicant shall be able to
- operate under the terms of the expired water exportation
- 120 permit until a final decision is made by the commission on
- 121 the renewal of such permit.
- 122 (2) In the absence of an appeal as provided under
- chapter 536, the decision of the commission shall be final.
- 5. A water exportation permit shall be in effect for
- three years from the date of issuance. The permit holder
- shall annually report the water use volumes and withdrawal
- 127 rates to the department in a manner and on timelines
- 128 determined by the department.
- 129 6. The water exportation permit application shall
- include all water exportation requested by the applicant.
- 131 The water exportation permit may be approved in whole or in
- 132 part by the director or the commission. This section shall
- be interpreted to allow one applicant to include multiple
- 134 water withdrawals for export from various locations within
- one water exportation permit application.
- 136 7. A water exportation permit application shall
- include a designee or agent in the state of Missouri for
- 138 service of process and to receive other notices.
- 8. A major water user, as defined in section 256.400,
- 140 may request the department to reevaluate any existing water
- 141 exportation permit using the criteria under subsection 3 of
- 142 this section. The department shall create a mechanism for a
- 143 major water user to submit a request for reevaluation and
- 144 shall provide the major water user with the director's
- 145 findings within one hundred and twenty days of the request

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146 for reevaluation. After reevaluating the permit, the

147 director shall impose additional conditions necessary for

148 the continued exportation of water outside the state if the

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149 director determines that the existing permit is negatively

150 impacting the requesting major water user's beneficial use

of his or her water resources. The director's decision to

152 modify or to decline to modify the conditions in an existing

153 permit pursuant to this subsection shall be subject to

154 approval by the Missouri water resources commission.

- 9. Nothing in this section shall preclude a person from bringing any constitutional, statutory, or common law claim to vindicate or otherwise defend the person's water rights. A permit issued under this section shall not serve as a defense to any claim brought against a water permit
- If the attorney general receives a complaint that 161 10. 162 provisions of this section have been violated, or, at the request of the department, the attorney general shall bring 163 an injunctive action or other appropriate action in the name 164 165 of the people of the state to enforce provisions of this 166 section. Suit may be brought in Cole County, or in any county where the defendant's principal place of business is 167 located or where the withdrawal of water occurred in 168 169 violation of this section.
  - 11. Whenever a state of emergency is declared by the governor under section 44.100 for all, or any part of the state, based on drought conditions, the department shall reevaluate any existing water exportation permit. Any reevaluation completed under this section shall use the criteria under subsection 3 of this section. After reevaluation of the permit is complete, the department shall have the authority to impose additional conditions or revoke

- 181 resources. The director's decision to modify, revoke, or
- 182 make no changes to the permit shall be subject to the
- 183 approval or denial of the Missouri water resources

  - 640.408. 1. There is hereby established the "Missouri
  - 2 Water Resources Commission". The commission shall consist
  - 3 of nine members:
  - 4 (1) The director of the department of natural
  - 5 resources or the director's designee;
  - 6 (2) Two members of the house of representatives
  - 7 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives,
  - 8 with one of the appointees having substantial agricultural
  - 9 knowledge;
- 10 (3) Two members of the senate appointed by the
- 11 president pro tempore of the senate, with one of the
- 12 appointees having substantial agricultural knowledge;
- 13 (4) Chief of administration of the southeast Missouri
- 14 water district established under section 256.643 or the
- 15 chief's designee;
- 16 (5) The director of the department of agriculture or
- 17 the director's designee;
- 18 (6) The chair of the Missouri clean water commission
- 19 or the chair's designee;
- 20 (7) The chair of the Missouri soil and water districts
- 21 commission or the chair's designee.
- Each member of the Missouri water resources
- 23 commission shall serve without compensation but shall be
- 24 reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the
- 25 performance of their official duties.

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3. Each legislative member of the Missouri water resources commission is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage, and travel allowances paid to members of the general assembly serving on interim committees. The allowances specified in this subsection shall be paid from the amounts appropriated for that purpose.

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- The Missouri water resources commission shall meet 32 33 at least quarterly to receive general updates by the 34 director of the department of natural resources regarding 35 Missouri water resource availability. They shall, as required by section 640.406, meet in an expeditious manner 36 to fulfill the duties set forth in section 640.406. 37 commission shall elect a chairman bi-annually and shall have 38 39 a quorum when at least five members are present.
- 5. No member appointed under subdivision (2) or (3) of subsection 1 of this section shall serve for more than six years total in his or her capacity as a member of the general assembly.

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
