**SB 1623** – By Trent.

An Act to repeal sections 428.049, 456.031, 456.1-103, 456.4-419, 456.5-505, and 456.8-808, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof six new sections relating to trusts.

**SB 1624** – By Williams.

An Act to repeal section 59.313, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the duties of the recorder of deeds.

**SB 1625** – By Williams.

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 890, Page 26, Section 192.667, Line 221, by striking the opening bracket “[“ on said line; and further amend line 233 by striking the closing bracket “]” on said line; and

Further amend said bill and section, page 27, line 268 by striking the second opening bracket “[“ and second closing bracket “]” on said line; and further amend said line by striking “18”; and

Further renumber the remaining subsections accordingly.

Senator Coleman moved that the above amendment be adopted, which motion prevailed.

Senator Burger assumed the Chair.

Senator Roberts offered **SA 2**:

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 2

Amend Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 890, Page 1, In the Title, Line 27, by striking “obsolete”; and

Further amend said bill, page 3, section 23.295, line 6, by inserting after all of said line the following:

**“37.1300. For the purposes of sections 37.1300 to 37.1330, the following terms mean:**

**(1) “Council”, the Missouri GIS advisory council established in section 37.1310;**

**(2) “Geographic information system (GIS)”, a computer system for capturing, storing, checking, and displaying data related to positions on the Earth’s surface that enables easily seeing, analyzing, and understanding patterns and relationships;**

**(3) “Geospatial”, relating to or denoting data that is associated with a particular location;**

**(4) “Missouri Spatial Data Information Service” or “MSDIS”, Missouri’s primary spatial data clearinghouse responsible for collecting and distributing vector data, aerial photography, and light detection and ranging elevation data that are generated, updated, and funded by state, local, and regional agencies and governments.**

**37.1310. There is hereby established within the office of administration the “Missouri GIS Advisory Council”, which is charged with assisting and advising the state in ensuring the availability, implementation, and enhancement of a statewide geospatial data infrastructure common to all jurisdictions. The council shall be established within the information technology services division of the office of administration. The council shall serve to support the existing geospatial infrastructure within the state of Missouri and strive toward immediate access to statewide geospatial data for all citizens of this state, especially life-safety entities including NG9-1-1.**

**37.1320. 1. The council shall consist of members that represent a cross-section of subject matter experts striking a geographic balance from all regions across the state. Representation should at a minimum include:**

**(1) The commissioner of administration, or the commissioner’s designee;**

**(2) The director of the department of conservation, or the director’s designee;**

**(3) The director of the department of economic development, or the director’s designee;**

**(4) The director of the department of health and senior services, or the director’s designee;**

**(5) The director of the department of natural resources, or the director’s designee;**

**(6) The adjutant general of the department of the national guard, or the adjutant general’s designee;**

**(7) The director of the department of public safety, or the director’s designee;**

**(8) The director of the department of transportation, or the director’s designee;**

- (9) **The director of the United States Geological Survey, or the director's designee;**
- (10) **The chief of the United States Department of Agriculture – Natural Resource Conservation Service, or the chief's designee;**
- (11) **The chair of the Missouri 911 service board, or the chair's designee;**
- (12) **The director of the Missouri Spatial Data Information Service, or the director's designee;**
- (13) **The director of the state land surveyor program, or the director's designee;**
- (14) **Director of the National Geospatial Agency West, or the director's designee;**
- (15) **Secretary of state, or the secretary's designee; and**
- (16) **No less than fourteen citizens of Missouri, appointed by the commissioner of administration or the commissioner's designee. Such individuals shall represent federal, city, county, and local government; the private sector; public safety; licensed professional land surveyors; and academia.**
- 2. By invitation of the council, additional subject matter experts may participate in activities as non-council members and do not require an appointment by the commissioner of administration.**
- 3. Appointed members of the council shall serve two-year terms and shall serve until their successors are appointed. Vacancies on the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment and such member appointed shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term.**
- 4. The council shall convene, at a minimum, quarterly and as otherwise required by the commissioner of administration or the office of geospatial information.**
- 5. The council shall designate from its members a chair and chair-elect for one-year terms and shall adopt written guidelines to govern the management of the council.**
- 6. Each appointed member of the council shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as members of the council, subject to appropriations for the council.**
- 7. The council shall designate from its members an executive secretary for the council, who shall maintain the records and decisions of the council's activities in accordance with state statute and shall be responsible for correspondence between the council and other agencies.**
- 8. The council shall not collect any personally identifiable information of any individual person. For purposes of this subsection, the term “personally identifiable information” means information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity, such as name, social security number, or biometric data records, either alone or when combined with other personal or identifying information that is linked or linkable to a specific individual.”; and**

Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.

Senator Roberts moved that the above amendment be adopted.

Senator Coleman raised a point of order that SA 2 goes beyond the scope of the underlying bill.

The point of order was referred to the President Pro Tem, who ruled it well taken.

Senator Webber offered **SA 3**:

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 3

Amend Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 890, Page 3, Section 105.1650, Line 13, by inserting after all of said line the following:

“138.190. There is hereby created within the state department of revenue a commission to be known and designated as the “State Tax Commission”. The director of revenue shall have no supervision, authority or control over such actions or decisions of the state tax commission as relates to its duties prescribed by law. The state tax commission shall be composed of [~~three~~] **five** members, chosen from the two major political parties, who shall be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, one of whom shall be designated chairman, and to hold office for staggered terms of six years]; provided, however, that of members first appointed, one member shall be appointed for a term of two years, one member for a term of four years, and one member for a term of six years]. Each commissioner shall hold office until his successor shall qualify.

138.200. 1. Each commissioner shall be a qualified voter and taxpayer and resident of the state for at least five years next preceding his appointment. At all times the state tax commission shall be so constituted that not more than [~~two~~] **three** members shall be of the same political party.

2. In the event of a vacancy occurring while the general assembly is not in session, the governor may appoint a temporary member of the commission to serve until such time as a permanent appointment can be made with the advice and consent of the senate.

3. Each commissioner shall devote his full time and efforts to the discharge of his duties and shall not accept any private employment of any kind or nature while serving on the commission nor hold any other office under the laws of this state, or any city, or county, or city and county, in this state, nor any office under the government of the United States.

4. No commissioner or employee of the commission shall hold any position of profit, engage in any occupation or business interfering with, or inconsistent with, his duties as commissioner or employee. No person is eligible to appointment or shall hold the office of commissioner, or be appointed by the commission, or hold any office or position under the commission, who holds any official office or position or who is a stockholder or who is in any wise pecuniarily interested in any common carrier, public utility, or any other corporation whose original assessment is made by the commission, as provided by this chapter. The words “original assessment” as used herein shall not be held or construed to include the assessment of corporation franchise tax.”; and

Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.

Senator Webber moved that the above amendment be adopted.

Senator Coleman raised a point of order that **SA 3** goes beyond the scope of the underlying bill.

The point of order was referred to the President Pro Tem, who ruled it well taken.

Senator Beck offered **SA 4**:

## SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 4

Amend Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 890, Page 3, Section 105.1650, Line 13, by inserting after all of said line the following:

“160.425. 1. The “Missouri Charter Public School Commission” is hereby created **within the department of elementary and secondary education** with the authority to sponsor high quality charter schools throughout the state of Missouri.

2. The commission shall consist of nine members appointed by the [governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate] **state board of education**. No more than five of the members shall be of the same political party. No more than two members shall be from the same congressional district. The term of office of each member shall be four years, except those of the members first appointed, of which three shall be appointed for a term of one year, two for a term of two years, two for a term of three years, and two for a term of four years. At the expiration of the term of each member, the [governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate,] **state board of education** shall appoint a successor.

3. [The appointees to the commission shall be selected as follows:]

[(1) One member selected by the governor from a slate of three recommended by the commissioner of education;]

[(2) One member selected by the governor from a slate of three recommended by the commissioner of higher education;]

[(3) One member selected by the governor from a slate of three recommended by the president pro tempore of the senate;]

[(4) One member selected by the governor from a slate of three recommended by the speaker of the house of representatives; and]

[(5) Five additional members appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be selected from a slate of three nominees recommended by the Missouri School Boards Association.]

[4.] Members appointed to the commission shall collectively possess strong experience and expertise in governance, management and finance, school leadership, assessment, curriculum and instruction, and education law. All members of the commission shall have demonstrated understanding of and commitment to charter schooling as a strategy for strengthening public education.

[5.] 4. The commission shall annually elect a chairperson and vice chairperson, who shall act as chairperson in his or her absence. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairperson. The chairperson may call meetings at such times as he or she deems advisable and shall call a meeting when requested to do so by three or more members of the commission. Members of the commission are not eligible to receive compensation.

[6.] 5. The commission may approve proposed charters for its sponsorship under sections 160.400 to 160.425 and shall:

(1) Comply with all of the requirements applicable to sponsors under sections 160.400 to 160.425;

(2) Exercise sponsorship over charters approved by the commission under sections 160.400 to 160.425, including receipt of sponsorship funding under subsection 11 of section 160.400. Sponsorship funding due to the commission shall be deposited to the credit of the charter public school commission revolving fund created pursuant to this section.

[7.] 6. Charter schools sponsored by the commission shall comply with all of the requirements applicable to charter schools under sections 160.400 to 160.425.

[8.] 7. The commission shall conduct its business in accordance with chapter 610.

[9.] 8. The department of elementary and secondary education shall provide start-up funding for the commission to operate. The commission shall reimburse the department's costs from any funds it receives as sponsor under section 160.400.

[10.] 9. The commission is authorized to receive and expend gifts, grants, and donations of any kind from any public or private entity to carry out the purposes of sections 160.400 to 160.425, subject to the terms and conditions under which they are given, provided that all such terms and conditions are permissible under law.

[11.] 10. There is hereby created in the state treasury the “Charter Public School Commission Revolving Fund”, which shall consist of moneys collected under this section. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Subject to appropriation, moneys in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this section.”; and

Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.

Senator Beck moved that the above amendment be adopted.

Senator Gregory (21) assumed the Chair.

At the request of Senator Coleman, **SB 890**, with **SCS**, **SS** for **SCS**, and **SA 4** (pending), was placed on the Informal Calendar.
