ANACT

To amend chapter 173, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to college tuition for dependents of certain veterans.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 173, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 173.237, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 173.237. 1. This section shall be known and may be
- 2 cited as the "Missouri Disabled Veterans' Dependents Tuition
- 3 Waiver".
- 4 2. As used in this section, the following terms mean:
- 5 (1) "Board", the coordinating board for higher
- 6 education;
- 7 (2) "Institution", any approved public institution, as
- 8 defined in subdivision (3) of subsection 1 of section
- 9 173.1102;
- 10 (3) "Tuition", any tuition or incidental fee, or both,
- 11 charged by an institution for attendance at the institution
- 12 by a student as a resident of this state, but not to exceed
- 13 the amount of tuition charged to a Missouri resident at the
- 14 University of Missouri-Columbia for attendance;
- 15 (4) "Tuition waiver" or "waiver", a tuition waiver
- 16 granted pursuant to the provisions of this section.

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- 17 3. A dependent of a veteran shall be eligible for a 18 waiver of all tuition remaining due to an institution after 19 subtracting awarded federal financial aid grants and state 20 scholarships and grants if the dependent meets the following 21 requirements:
- 22 The dependent is a resident of this state who (1) 23 meets the institution's requirements for establishing 24 Missouri residency for the purpose of paying in-state 25 tuition;
- 26 (2) The dependent has a parent, stepparent, or spouse 27 who is or was a member of the armed forces of the United 28 States who:
 - Died while on active duty; (a)

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- 30 Died of a service-connected disability; (b)
- 31 Died subsequent to discharge from the armed forces 32 as a result of injury or illness sustained while serving as 33 a member of the armed forces, whether or not the injury or 34 illness resulted in total disability;
 - Is rated as permanently and totally disabled as a result of military service as certified by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, excluding temporary total disability ratings or other temporary disability ratings given for conditions expected to improve, but including ratings for total disability based on individual unemployability if the unemployability is permanent; or
 - Is classified as missing in action or as a prisoner of war during armed hostilities while serving as a member of the armed forces; and
- If the dependent is a child or stepchild of a 46 veteran described in subdivision (2) of this subsection, 47 such dependent shall be under twenty-six years of age, 48 unless the dependent serves on active duty with the armed

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- 49 forces of the United States after such dependent's
- 50 eighteenth birthday but before such dependent's twenty-sixth
- 51 birthday, in which case the eligibility period shall end
- 52 five years after the date of the dependent's first discharge
- or release from duty from the armed forces, but in no event
- 54 shall such eligibility period be extended beyond the
- 55 dependent's thirty-first birthday.
- 4. An application for a tuition waiver shall be
- 57 submitted on a form to be prescribed by the executive
- 58 director of the Missouri veterans commission. The executive
- 59 director shall ensure that the application process is
- 60 accessible, transparent, and efficiently administered.
- 5. The executive director of the Missouri veterans
- 62 commission or the executive director's designee shall:
- 63 (1) Establish application procedures by prescribing
- 64 and providing all necessary forms, setting application
- 65 deadlines, and determining required documentation for
- 66 dependents of disabled veterans to apply for the tuition
- 67 waiver;
- 68 (2) Review and determine applicant eligibility, verify
- 69 documentation, and certify approved applicants. Upon
- 70 certification, the executive director shall notify the
- 71 applicant and the institution in which the applicant desires
- 72 to enroll. The executive director's decision shall be final
- 73 and binding, absent fraud or misrepresentation;
- 74 (3) Promulgate necessary rules and regulations to
- 75 ensure effective administration of this section, including
- 76 procedures for eligibility verification, fraud prevention,
- 77 and program oversight;
- 78 (4) Coordinate with the board to facilitate
- 79 communication with institutions, ensure proper

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80 implementation of waivers, and maintain program efficiency;

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- 81 **and**
- 82 (5) Oversee program compliance and reporting by
- 83 maintaining records of waiver recipients, monitoring
- 84 participation, and providing periodic reports to the board.
- 85 6. The board shall:
- 86 (1) Ensure consistent implementation of this section
- 87 across all institutions, including institutional compliance
- 88 and reporting;
- 89 (2) Develop and distribute procedures and guidelines
- 90 for institutions to process tuition waivers, ensuring that
- 91 certified applicants are enrolled without tuition charges;
- 92 **and**
- 93 (3) Coordinate with the Missouri veterans commission
- 94 to ensure seamless communication between certifying
- 95 authorities and institutions, preventing administrative
- 96 delays for eligible applicants.
- 97 7. The waiver shall be valid for one degree, diploma,
- 98 or certificate from a community college and one
- 99 baccalaureate degree from a state college or university.
- 100 Receipt of such degree, diploma, or certificate from a
- 101 community college shall precede receipt of such
- 102 baccalaureate degree.
- 103 8. (1) A recipient of a tuition waiver shall be
- 104 ineligible for any other state-funded veteran-dependent
- 105 tuition grant, waiver, or scholarship, including, but not
- 106 limited to, grants established in sections 173.234 and
- 107 173.236.
- 108 (2) A student who has previously received any other
- 109 state-funded veteran-dependent tuition grant, waiver, or
- 110 scholarship, including, but not limited to, grants
- 111 established in sections 173.234 and 173.236, shall not be

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eligible to receive a tuition waiver pursuant to this section.

- (3) A student shall not concurrently receive a tuition
 waiver pursuant to this section and any other state-funded
 veteran-dependent tuition grant, waiver, or scholarship,
 including, but not limited to, grants established in
 sections 173.234 and 173.236, but such student may elect to
 use the program that provides the greatest financial benefit.
 - 9. A recipient of a tuition waiver may transfer from one institution to another without losing such recipient's entitlement to such tuition waiver.
 - 10. If a recipient of a tuition waiver is granted financial assistance under any other student aid program, whether public or private, the full amount of such financial assistance shall be reported to the Missouri veterans commission by the institution and the recipient.
- 128 11. The Missouri veterans commission shall promulgate 129 all necessary rules for the implementation of the provisions 130 of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under 131 132 the authority delegated in this section shall become 133 effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 134 135 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and 136 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly 137 pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective 138 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 139 140 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 141 2026, shall be invalid and void.

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
