AN ACT

To amend chapter 37, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the office of administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 37, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 37.840, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 37.840. 1. This section shall be known and may be
- 2 cited as the "Hope Missouri" act.
- 3 2. For purposes of this section, the following terms
- 4 mean:
- 5 (1) "Care plan", a written document that contains
- 6 information provided by the office of administration to its
- 7 participants for whom actionable steps and corresponding
- 8 timelines have been developed and customized to assist the
- 9 participants in achieving their immediate, intermediate, and
- 10 long-term goals. The care plan shall also address barriers
- 11 by directly connecting participants to community resources
- 12 and opportunities;
- 13 (2) "Hope Missouri partner network", a group of
- 14 entities, including state departments and agencies, public-
- 15 private partnerships, and nonprofit, private-sector, and
- 16 faith-based organizations, which is actively engaged in the
- 17 mission of the hope Missouri office and which provides goods

or services to directly support the participants' goals and address identified barriers;

- 20 (3) "Hope line", a statewide toll-free telephone
 21 number that serves as a hotline for hope Missouri inquiries
 22 and referrals for services;
- 23 (4) "Hope navigators", individuals who coordinate care
 24 and assist participants and families seeking services
 25 through hope Missouri;
- 26 (5) "Office", the hope Missouri office within the office of administration;
- 28 (6) "Participant", an individual who voluntarily 29 participates in hope Missouri;
- 30 (7) "Participating state agency", a state department, 31 division, or agency that takes part in hope Missouri at the 32 direction of the commissioner of administration.
- 33 3. (1) The "Hope Missouri Office" is hereby created 34 within the office of administration. The commissioner of 35 administration shall serve as the director of the hope 36 Missouri office.
 - (2) The office shall:

- 38 (a) Establish goals and strategies to accomplish the 39 mission of hope Missouri;
- 40 (b) Facilitate coordination and collaboration among
 41 participating state agencies to achieve these goals;
- 42 (c) Expand the hope Missouri partner network to meet 43 the needs of participants;
- (d) Empower and assist participants in need to help
 identify and achieve immediate, intermediate, and long-term
 goals and remove barriers to personal goal achievement
 through the development and implementation of care plans in
 partnership with hope navigators;

- 49 (e) Use hope navigators to assist participants in
- 50 identifying personal goals, developing individualized plans
- 51 for achieving immediate, intermediate, and long-term goals,
- 52 identifying and addressing barriers, and actively connecting
- 53 participants to community resources and opportunities to
- 54 achieve their goals;
- 55 (f) Use participating state agencies to serve families
- 56 holistically in achieving self-sufficiency, maximizing
- 57 community integration, and building a prosperous future.
- 58 Barriers to self-sufficiency may include the inability to:
- 59 a. Obtain stable employment;
- 60 b. Increase wages;
- 61 c. Obtain the necessary skills for greater
- 62 independence, education, or training;
- d. Meet basic needs; and
- 64 e. Find stable housing;
- 65 (q) Refer participants requiring assistance with
- 66 employment or vocational training to appropriate entities to
- 67 prepare, train, and place the participants in meaningful
- 68 employment.
- 69 (3) (a) To participate in hope Missouri, an
- 70 individual shall be:
- 71 a. A legal resident of this state;
- 72 b. A citizen of the United States or a permanent
- 73 resident alien of the United States, as determined by the
- 74 United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services;
- 75 c. (i) At least eighteen years of age;
- 76 (ii) If emancipated, at least sixteen years of age; or
- 77 (iii) If under eighteen years of age and not
- 78 emancipated, authorized to participate by written consent of
- 79 his or her parent or guardian.
- 80 (b) Participation in hope Missouri is voluntary.

81 (c) Individuals may receive assistance by calling the 82 hope line.

- 83 (4) The office shall designate a state agency to, at a 84 minimum:
- 85 (a) Operate the hope line, which shall be available, 86 at a minimum, during business hours Monday through Friday;
- 87 (b) Develop and maintain a website for individuals to 88 connect with hope Missouri;
- (c) Develop and maintain a hope Missouri case
 management system that, at a minimum, conducts intake for
 hope Missouri inquiries and makes referrals for individuals
 and families in need of services.
- 93 4. (a) Hope navigators shall serve as resources (1) 94 who shall be embedded within communities and serve as 95 catalysts and a single point of contact for participants. Hope navigators shall use participant information to jointly 96 97 develop and implement care plans and navigate and actively 98 leverage community-based supports and opportunities to 99 create a sustainable network of supports to help 100 participants achieve their goals, overcome barriers, and 101 realize their full potential.
- (b) A care plan shall, at a minimum, include
 actionable steps and corresponding timelines to address
 immediate, intermediate, and long-term goals and barriers to
 achieving such goals to help participants achieve their
 personal goals. Personal goals may include goals related to
 barriers to self-sufficiency.
- 108 (2) The hope Missouri partner network shall work to
 109 build a network of partnerships to sustain the effectiveness
 110 of hope Missouri.

111 (3) (a) State agencies shall participate in hope 112 Missouri at the direction of the commissioner of 113 administration.

(b) In order to use government resources more
effectively and efficiently, participating state agencies
shall use existing resources and personnel, to the extent
possible, to operate hope Missouri.
