AN ACT

To repeal section 173.250, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to higher education workforce policy prioritization.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 173.250, RSMo, is repealed and two new

- 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
- 3 173.250 and 173.1541, to read as follows:

173.250. 1. There is hereby established a "Higher

- 2 Education Academic Scholarship Program" and any moneys
- 3 appropriated by the general assembly for this program shall
- 4 be used to provide scholarships for Missouri citizens to
- 5 attend a Missouri college or university of their choice
- 6 pursuant to the provisions of this section.
- 7 2. The definitions of terms set forth in section
- 8 173.1102 shall be applicable to such terms as used in this
- 9 section. In addition, the following definitions shall apply:
- 10 (1) "Academic scholarship", an amount of money paid by
- 11 the state of Missouri to a student pursuant to the
- 12 provisions of this section;
- (2) "ACT", the American College Testing program
- 14 examination;
- 15 (3) "Approved institution", an approved public or
- 16 approved private institution as defined in section 173.1102;

17 (4) "Eligible student", an individual who meets the
18 criteria set forth in section 173.1104, excluding the
19 requirements of financial need and undergraduate status and,
20 in addition, meets the following requirements:

- (a) Has achieved a qualifying score on the ACT or SAT;
- (b) Is a Missouri resident who has completed secondary coursework through graduation from high school or the virtual public school established in section 161.670, receipt of a general education development (GED) diploma, completion of a program of study through homeschooling or any other program of academic instruction that satisfies the compulsory attendance requirement under section 167.031; and
- (c) Is enrolled full time or accepted for full-time enrollment as a postsecondary student at an approved institution during the academic year immediately following the completion of his or her secondary coursework;
- 33 (5) "Missouri test-takers", all Missouri high school
 34 seniors who take the ACT or the SAT;
- 35 (6) "Qualifying score", a composite score on the ACT
 36 or the SAT achieved in an eligible student's high school
 37 sophomore, junior, or senior year that is in the top five
 38 percent of Missouri test-takers, as established at the
 39 beginning of an eligible student's final year of secondary
 40 coursework;
 - (7) "Recipient", an eligible or renewal student who receives an academic scholarship pursuant to this section;
 - (8) "Renewal student", an eligible student who remains in compliance with the provisions of section 173.1104, maintains continuous enrollment, and makes satisfactory academic degree progress; and
 - (9) "SAT", the Scholastic Aptitude Test.

- 3. The coordinating board for higher education shall be the administrative agency for the implementation of the program established by this section, and shall:
 - (1) Promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the exercise of its functions and the effectuation of the purposes of this section, including regulations for granting scholarship deferments;
 - (2) Prescribe the form and the time and method of awarding academic scholarships, and shall supervise the processing thereof; and
 - (3) Select qualified recipients to receive academic scholarships, make such awards of academic scholarships to qualified recipients and determine the manner and method of payment to the recipient.
 - 4. Before the 2027-28 academic year, eligible students shall be offered academic scholarships in the following amounts and in the following order of priority, within the limits of the funds appropriated and made available:
 - (1) Each eligible student with a qualifying score in the top three percent of all Missouri test-takers shall be offered an academic scholarship of up to three thousand dollars per year. All students in the top three percent shall receive awards of three thousand dollars before any student in the top fourth and fifth percentiles receives any award;
 - (2) Provided sufficient funds are appropriated, each eligible student with a qualifying score in the top fourth and fifth percentiles shall be offered an academic scholarship of up to one thousand dollars per year.
 - 5. Before the 2027-28 academic year, eligible students may renew academic scholarships for their second, third, and fourth years of postsecondary education, or as long as the

80 recipient is in compliance with the criteria to be a renewal student.

- 6. If an eligible student is unable to enroll during the first academic year or a renewal student ceases attendance at an approved institution for the purpose of providing service to a nonprofit organization, a state or federal government agency, or any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, such student shall be offered an academic scholarship upon enrollment in any approved institution after the completion of their service, if the student meets all other requirements for an initial or renewal award and if the following criteria are met:
- approved institution as a result of service to a nonprofit organization or the state or federal government, the student returns to full-time status within twenty-seven months and provides verification to the coordinating board for higher education that the service to the nonprofit organization was satisfactorily completed and was not compensated other than for expenses, or that the service to the state or federal government was satisfactorily completed; or
- approved institution as a result of military service in the Armed Forces of the United States, the student returns to full-time status within six months after the eligible student first ceases service to the Armed Forces and provides verification to the coordinating board for higher education that the military service was satisfactorily completed.
- 7. A recipient of an academic scholarship awarded under this section may transfer from one approved

institution to another without losing eligibility for the academic scholarship.

- 113 8. If a recipient of an academic scholarship at any
 114 time withdraws from an approved institution so that under
 115 the rules and regulations of that institution he or she is
 116 entitled to a refund of any tuition, fees or other charges,
 117 the institution shall pay the portion of the refund
 118 attributable to the academic scholarship for that term to
 119 the coordinating board for higher education.
- 120 9. Other provisions of this section to the contrary 121 notwithstanding, if an eligible student has been awarded an 122 initial academic scholarship pursuant to the provisions of 123 this section but is unable to attend an approved institution 124 during the first academic year because of illness, 125 disability, pregnancy or other medical need or if a renewal 126 student ceases all attendance at an approved institution 127 because of illness, disability, pregnancy or other medical 128 need, the recipient shall be eligible for an initial or 129 renewal academic scholarship upon enrollment in or return to 130 any approved institution, provided the recipient:
- 131 (1) Enrolls in or returns to full-time status within
 132 twenty-seven months;
- (2) Provides verification in compliance with

 coordinating board for higher education rules of sufficient

 medical evidence documenting an illness, disability,

 pregnancy or other medical need of such person to require

 that that person will not be able to use the academic

 scholarship during the time period for which it was

 originally offered; and
- (3) Meets all other requirements established foreligibility to receive an academic scholarship.

142 10. (1) As used in this section, "eligible program of study" has the same meaning as in section 173.2553.

- 144 (2) For the 2027-28 academic year and all subsequent 145 academic years, subject to appropriation:
- (a) An eligible student shall be offered academic scholarships in an amount equal to the actual in-state tuition charged to such eligible student for the first four semesters the student is enrolled at the approved institution;
- 151 (b) An eligible student who has completed the
 152 student's first two semesters and received an academic
 153 scholarship under subsections 1 to 9 of this section shall
 154 be deemed an eligible student under paragraph (a) of this
 155 subdivision for the student's third and fourth semesters; and
 - (c) A renewal student who is enrolled in an eligible program of study may renew academic scholarships for up to six semesters in an amount equal to the actual in-state tuition charged to such eligible student as long as the recipient is in compliance with the criteria to be a renewal student.
 - 173.1541. 1. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Missouri Higher Education Funding Policy Prioritization Act".
 - 2. The Missouri department of higher education and workforce development, in consultation with public institutions of higher education in this state, shall:
 - 7 (1) Develop a funding model for public institutions of 8 higher education that:
 - 9 (a) Aligns funding for higher education to develop 10 educated persons to meet the professional and workforce 11 needs for the state of Missouri;

12 (b) Provides a level of stable, sustainable resources 13 that allow public institutions of higher education in this 14 state to serve students well and fulfill such institutions' 15 missions:

- (c) Is based on the 2023 study commissioned by the Missouri department of higher education and workforce development and is developed in cooperation with public institutions of higher education in this state and the Missouri department of higher education and workforce development using data, mechanics, and calculations that are as simple and easy to understand as practicable;
- (d) Includes a process for the allocation of the core appropriations to public four-year institutions of higher education; public community colleges, as that term is defined in section 163.191; and State Technical College of Missouri;
- (e) Uses a cost-based approach to funding that recognizes each institution's instructional mission and that incorporates accountability and an outcomes-based focus; and
- (f) Includes a performance component that is designed to enhance improvement in student success and efficient operations;
- (2) Establish a plan for testing and implementing the funding model described in this section, which plan, after having been reviewed and consented to by two members of the Missouri house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and two members of the Missouri senate appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate, shall be approved by the coordinating board for higher education and submitted to the governor and the general assembly before August 31, 2026;

- 43 (3) Evaluate the effectiveness of the funding model 44 test and submit a report to the governor, the speaker of the 45 house of representatives, and the president pro tempore of 46 the senate before October 15, 2026; and
- 47 (4) Present the funding model to the coordinating 48 board for higher education for final approval before 49 November 1, 2026.
- 3. Such funding model shall not become effective unless approved by the general assembly by concurrent resolution.
- 4. For the 2028-29 fiscal year and all subsequent
 fiscal years, the appropriation of state funding to public
 four-year institutions of higher education; public community
 colleges, as that term is defined in section 163.191; and
 State Technical College of Missouri shall be in accordance
 with such funding model approved by the general assembly.
