## AN ACT

To amend chapter 579, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to abortifacient drugs, with penalty provisions.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Chapter 579, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto  
2 one new section, to be known as section 579.017, to read as  
3 follows:

579.017. 1. (1) A person commits the offense of  
2 possession of an abortifacient drug if he or she knowingly  
3 possesses an abortifacient drug, including, but not limited  
4 to, mifepristone (RU-486) or any other drug used alone or in  
5 combination with another to induce an abortion, with the  
6 intent to induce an abortion on themselves or another person.

7 (2) The offense of possession of an abortifacient drug  
8 is a class C felony.

9 (3) It shall be an affirmative defense for any person  
10 to allege to have violated this subsection that the person  
11 knowingly possessed the abortifacient drug to induce an  
12 abortion because of a medical emergency, as such term is  
13 defined in section 188.015.

14 2. (1) A person commits the offense of delivery of an  
15 abortifacient drug if he or she knowingly distributes or  
16 delivers, attempts to distribute or deliver, or knowingly  
17 possesses with an intent to distribute or deliver, an

18 abortifacient drug, including, but not limited to,  
19 mifepristone (RU-486) or any other drug used alone or in  
20 combination with another to induce an abortion, with the  
21 intent to induce, or otherwise assist in inducing, an  
22 abortion on another person.

23 (2) The offense of delivery of an abortifacient drug  
24 is a class C felony.

25 (3) It shall be an affirmative defense for any person  
26 to allege to have violated this subsection that the person  
27 knowingly distributed or delivered the abortifacient drug to  
28 induce an abortion because of a medical emergency, as such  
29 term is defined in section 188.015.
