AN ACT

To amend chapter 571, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to the offense of community endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 571, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 two new sections, to be known as sections 571.400 and 571.401,
- 3 to read as follows:
 - 571.400. 1. As used in this section, the following
- 2 terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Secure gun storage", a safe, gun safe, gun case,
- 4 lock box, or other device that is designed to be or can be
- 5 used to store a firearm and that is designed to be unlocked
- 6 only by means of a key, a combination, or other similar
- 7 means;
- 8 (2) "Unauthorized person", a person who is prohibited
- 9 from possessing a firearm under state or federal law.
- 10 2. A person commits the offense of community
- 11 endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm in the first
- 12 degree if a person stores or leaves a firearm in a location
- 13 where the person knows or reasonably should know that an
- 14 unauthorized person may gain access to the firearm and such
- 15 unauthorized person causes personal injury or death with the
- 16 firearm.

3. The offense of community endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm in the first degree is a class C felony.

- 4. It shall not be a violation of this section if:
- 20 (1) The firearm is stored in a secure gun storage, or
- 21 other secured storage with a trigger lock or similar device
- 22 that is designed to prevent the unauthorized use or
- 23 discharge of the firearm;
- 24 (2) The unauthorized person is a minor who has the
- 25 permission of a parent or guardian to possess the firearm
- 26 and is supervised by a person eighteen years of age or older;
- 27 (3) The unauthorized person obtains or discharges the
- 28 firearm in a lawful act of self-defense pursuant to chapter
- 29 **563**; or

15 and such unauthorized person:

- (1) Causes the firearm to discharge;
- 17 (2) Carries, exhibits, or displays the firearm in a 18 public place in a manner that is intended to intimidate 19 another or that warrants alarm for the safety of other 20 persons; or
- 21 (3) Uses the firearm in the commission of a crime.
- 3. The offense of community endangerment due to unsafe storage of a firearm in the second degree is a class D felony.
- 25 4. It shall not be a violation of this section if:
- 26 (1) The firearm is stored in a secure gun storage, or 27 other secured storage with a trigger lock or similar device 28 that is designed to prevent the unauthorized use or 29 discharge of the firearm;
 - (2) The unauthorized person is a minor who has the permission of a parent or guardian to possess the firearm and is supervised by a person eighteen years of age or older;
- 33 (3) The unauthorized person obtains or discharges the 34 firearm in a lawful act of self-defense pursuant to chapter 35 563; or
 - (4) The unauthorized person obtains the firearm as a result of an unlawful entry and such unlawful entry is reported to a law enforcement agency within five days of the time he or she knew or reasonably should have known that the firearm had been taken.
