## **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 590, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to a training program for Missouri rangers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 590, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 590.1300, to read as
- 3 follows:
  - 590.1300. 1. The POST commission shall establish a
- 2 training program to be known as the "Missouri Rangers", and
- 3 shall establish minimum standards for training instructors,
- 4 training centers, and training programs that focus on
- 5 preventing and responding to emergency or violent crisis
- 6 situations in school settings.
- 7 2. (1) Each person seeking entrance into the Missouri
- 8 rangers training program shall submit a fingerprint card and
- 9 authorization for a criminal history background check to
- 10 include the records of the Federal Bureau of Investigation
- 11 to the training center or training program where such person
- 12 is seeking entrance. The training center or training
- 13 program shall cause a criminal history background check to
- 14 be made and shall cause the resulting report to be forwarded
- 15 to the agency where the applicant is seeking to be
- 16 designated as a Missouri ranger.

- 17 (2) No person shall be admitted to a Missouri ranger
- 18 training center or training program unless such person
- 19 submits proof to the training center or training program
- 20 that he or she has a valid concealed carry endorsement or
- 21 permit.
- 3. The arrest powers granted to any person who
- 23 successfully completes the Missouri rangers training program
- 24 shall be limited to offenses established under chapter 571
- 25 and any offense under chapter 569.140 or 569.155 involving
- 26 school property. The provisions of this subsection shall
- 27 not apply to any person who is an active law enforcement
- 28 officer.
- 29 4. The POST commission shall develop a training
- 30 program that shall include:
- 31 (1) For applicants who are not active or retired law
- 32 enforcement or military personnel, a program that is not
- 33 longer than three months, and that shall consist of:
- 34 (a) State and federal constitutional and statutory law
- 35 relating to search and seizure;
- 36 (b) Firearms training;
- 37 (c) Defensive tactics; and
- 38 (d) Physical training, provided that no person shall
- 39 receive a credential under this subdivision unless such
- 40 person is able to:
- 41 a. Run one and one-half miles in less than twelve
- 42 minutes and thirty seconds;
- 43 b. Complete a minimum of four pull-ups;
- 44 c. Complete a minimum of forty pushups in less than
- 45 one minute; and
- 46 d. Complete fifty crunches in less than one minute;
- 47 (2) For applicants who are active or retired military
- 48 personnel, including active or retired members of the

49 National Guard, a program that is not longer than two

- 50 months, and that shall consist of:
- 51 (a) State and federal constitutional and statutory law
- 52 relating to search and seizure;
- 53 (b) Abbreviated firearms training;
- 54 (c) Abbreviated defensive tactics; and
- 55 (d) Abbreviated physical training, provided that no
- 56 person shall receive a credential under this subdivision
- 57 unless such person is able to:
- 58 a. Run one and one-half miles in less than fourteen
- 59 minutes;
- 60 b. Complete a minimum of three pull-ups;
- 61 c. Complete a minimum of thirty pushups in less than
- 62 one minute; and
- 63 d. Complete forty crunches in less than one minute;
- 64 (3) For applicants who are active or retired law
- 65 enforcement personnel, a program that is not longer than six
- 66 weeks, and that shall consist of:
- 67 (a) Abbreviated state and federal constitutional and
- 68 statutory law relating to search and seizure;
- 69 (b) Abbreviated firearms training;
- 70 (c) Abbreviated defensive tactics; and
- 71 (d) Abbreviated physical training.
- 72 5. A certificate of Missouri ranger training program
- 73 completion may be issued to any applicant by any approved
- 74 Missouri ranger training instructor. On the certificate of
- 75 program completion, the approved Missouri ranger training
- 76 instructor shall affirm that the individual receiving
- 77 instruction has taken and passed a Missouri ranger training
- 78 program that meets the requirements of this section and
- 79 shall indicate whether the individual has a valid concealed
- 80 carry endorsement or permit. The instructor shall also

81 provide a copy of such certificate to the director of the

82 department of public safety.
