

SENATE SUBSTITUTE
FOR
SENATE BILL NO. 201

AN ACT

To repeal sections 221.160 and 550.030, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the costs of imprisonment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI,
AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section A. Sections 221.160 and 550.030, RSMo, are repealed
2 and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as
3 sections 221.160 and 550.030, to read as follows:

4 221.160. When a person is charged with a felony offense,
5 the expenses of imprisonment of [any criminal prisoner] the
6 person, such as accrue before conviction from the date felony
7 charges are filed by the county prosecutor, shall be paid [in the
8 same manner as other costs of prosecution are directed to be
9 paid] by the state in the amount of fifty percent of expenses
10 reimbursed in accordance with section 221.105; and those which
11 accrue after conviction shall be paid [as is directed by the law
12 regulating criminal proceedings] by the state in the amount of
13 one hundred percent of expenses reimbursed in accordance with
14 section 221.105, and those subject to monitoring under section
15 221.025 shall be reimbursed by the state in the amount of one
16 hundred percent of expenses. When a person is charged with a
17 misdemeanor offense, the expenses of imprisonment, such as accrue
18 before sentencing and after conviction, shall be paid by the

1 county. Payment of imprisonment expenses shall be made by the
2 county or state and the prisoner shall reimburse the same after
3 payments made by the county or state as provided by law.

4 550.030. When the defendant is sentenced to imprisonment in
5 the county jail for violation of a county ordinance or
6 misdemeanor offense, or to pay a fine, or both, and is unable to
7 pay the costs, the county in which the indictment was found or
8 information filed shall pay the costs, [except such as were
9 incurred on the part of the defendant] and may seek reimbursement
10 from the defendant as provided by law. When the defendant is
11 sentenced to imprisonment in the county jail for a felony
12 offense, or to pay a fine, or both, and is unable to pay the
13 costs, the state shall pay the costs, and may seek reimbursement
14 from the defendant as provided by law.
