#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Office of the Attorney General, Office of State Public Defender, Office of State Courts Administrator and the Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Water Patrol each assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact. However, in response to similar legislation from the 2002 session, OPS assumed prosecutors could absorb the costs of the proposed legislation with existing resources.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

The proposal fiscally impact small businesses, as it would exempt watercraft outfitters from liability in certain situations.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The proposed legislation would exempt watercraft outfitters from liability for the death or injury of paddlesport activity participants resulting from the inherent risk of such an activity unless the outfitter: (1) intentionally injures the participant; (2) commits an act of negligence which proximately causes the death or injury; (3) negligently provides an unsafe watercraft or equipment; or (4) fails to provide a life jacket. The proposal would require every outfitter to post a sign that states the outfitter will not be responsible for the death or injury of a participant resulting from the inherent risks or paddlesport activities. In addition, every contract entered into by an outfitter and a participant must contain the warning.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
