No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

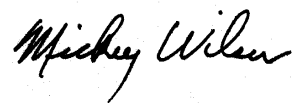
DESCRIPTION

This act authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to convey state property in Thousand Hills State Park to James Lyons. Consideration for the conveyance shall be the conveyance of property owned by Mr. Lyons to the Department of Natural Resources.
