FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of the State Public Defender, Office of the State Courts

Administrator, Department of Public Safety - Capitol Police and Fire Safety each assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DOLIR)** states this proposal simply clarifies the time that a crime is considered to have occurred. Pursuant to Section 595.025.2, RSMo, a claimant must file an application for benefits with the Crime Victims' Compensation Program within two years of the occurrence of a crime or the discovery of the crime upon which it is based.

DOLIR assumes that since the Crime Victims' Compensation Program has always operated on the premise that a crime occurs when an offender perpetrates the criminal act and not when a conviction is obtained, the revision simply clarifies existing statue.

Therefore, DOLIR assumes this proposal has no fiscal impact on the Crime Victims' Compensation Fund.
