# FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

In response to similar proposals, officials of the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, **Department of Social Services**, **Department of Insurance**, **State Courts Administrator**, and the **Attorney General** stated that the proposal would not affect their agencies, administratively.

**Secretary of State** officials stated, in response to similar proposals, that advertisement costs for the proposal would be \$3,684 per column inch for three printings of the text of the proposal, the introduction, fiscal note summary, and affidavit. The proposal would be on the ballot for the November 2004 general election.
