FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Division of Budget and Planning (BAP)** stated the proposal should not result in additional costs or savings to BAP. The proposal could result in general revenue costs of approximately \$4 million to fully fund the career ladder program.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** stated the FY05 projected need to pay the 2003-04 Career Ladder obligations is \$39,473,501. Because the foundation formula proration is less than 1.00 and the Career Ladder payment cannot currently be paid at a higher percentage (proration) than the foundation formula, the FY05 budget request for Career Ladder is \$35,526,150. Paying 100% of the Career Ladder obligation increases the state cost \$3,947,351 above the FY05 budget request.
