FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** and **Office of Administration**, **Division of Budget and Planning** stated that the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Secretary of State (SOS) officials stated that statewide newspaper publication of constitutional amendments costs approximately \$1,228 per column inch per publication. They estimated this proposal would require 10 column inches including title header and certification paragraph, for three required publications. (($$1228 \times 3 = $3,684$) x 10 = \$36,840).

Oversight assumes the referendum called for in this proposal would be held in November 2004.
