FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from **University of Central Missouri (UCM)** assume, while this proposal may not impose a direct fiscal impact, the amount of time and resources required to respond to grievances designed to enact action may prove to be significantly impactful. Additionally, the resources required to change UCM policies and procedures to mirror that of the University of Missouri may also prove very time consuming and costly in the long run.

It is not possible to determine an exact fiscal impact with the information provided in this note as there are a number of people on campus involved with investigating and resolving grievances.

Officials from **State Technical College of Missouri** assume this proposal could have a slight negative impact on the college. It is not possible to quantify the impact.

Officials from the **Missouri State University** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes, per the University of Missouri's Grievance Policy, "all regular employees have the right to file a grievance and probationary or non-regular employees may process a grievance concerning issues of prohibited discrimination or application/interpretation of University policies and procedures".

Oversight notes, per Missouri State University's Grievance Policy, "this grievance procedure applies only to non-probationary, full-time employees".

Oversight assumes this proposal allows any taxpayer to a file grievance at any public institution. Some institutions of higher education indicated costs to change policies/procedures and to respond to grievances filed. Oversight will show an unknown cost to colleges and universities that could exceed \$100.000.
