FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§407.020 and 407.025 - Provisions regarding unlawful merchandising practices

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the Governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration**, the **Office of Prosecution Services**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Conservation**, the **Office of Administration** and the **Missouri Department of Transportation** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

In response to similar legislation from this year, SCS for SB 276, officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assumed no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight notes that the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Conservation, the Office of Administration, the Missouri Department of Transportation and the Office of the Attorney General each has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization.
