FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** and the **Missouri Senate** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume no fiscal impact from the proposal. The House presumes if the delegate(s) selected are members of the General Assembly, the Joint Contingent appropriation will pay any reasonable expenses. If not the House will absorb any reasonable expenses of our member(s) serving as a delegate.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator (OSCA)** state there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Oversight assumes the proposal would not have a material fiscal impact on OSCA.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a material direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations if a convention is called. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

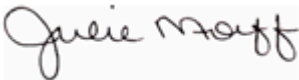
FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.

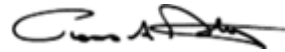
This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
