ASSUMPTION

In response to similar legislation from 2021, SB 357, officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight notes according to OSCA's FY 2023 Budget Book, as of January 2020, there are 15 family treatment courts serving 28 counties. These counties include Adair, Knox, Lewis, Jackson, Audrain, Pike, Lincoln, Boone, Callaway, Montgomery, Warren, St. Charles, St. Louis, Jefferson, St. Francois, Washington, Madison, Ste. Genevieve, Perry, Bollinger, Cape Girardeau, Scott, Mississippi, Dunklin, Stoddard, Greene, Newton and McDonald.
