ASSUMPTION

§334.935 – Respiratory Care Interstate Compact

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance (DCI)** assume the legislation has not passed in the minimum number of required states. It is uncertain if the compact would be enacted in FY 27, FY 28 or FY 29. Once the compact is enacted the Board for Respiratory Care could be required to pay fees charged to member states including an annual assessment to cover costs of operations and activities of the compact commission.

The department believes it can absorb the additional workload that would result from this legislation within existing appropriations and FTE. However, should the workload exceed expectations, the department would request an additional appropriation and/or FTE through the budget process to cover the increased costs.

Oversight assumes any revenue generated from licensure fees will be immaterial and therefore will not be reflected in the fiscal note.

Officials from the DCI assume the cost of the proposal can be absorbed. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this agency.
