## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

## DESCRIPTION

This proposal would establish the Office on Women's Health within the Department of Health. A new Section 192.965 would outline the duties of the Office, including assistance in assessing women's health needs in Missouri, providing policy analysis, identifying issues, and establishing priorities for the Director of the Department of Health, serving as a central location for information about women's health, promoting coordination of women's health efforts throughout Missouri, and increasing visibility of the many factors affecting the health and well-being of girls and women in Missouri. A new Section 192.968 would allow the Director of the Department of Health to appoint a committee of experts in girls' and women's health who would reflect the geographic, racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic diversity in the state. The committee would help the director identify and analyze issues and may provide policy advice.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
