FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal could have a direct fiscal impact on pawnbroker businesses in the state.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would allow a Sheriff to seize property in the possession of a pawnbroker if the Sheriff receives a report from a claimant that the property has been misappropriated and the property is reasonably identifiable as the property of the claimant. If the pawnbroker believes the property is not misappropriated they would then be entitled to file a cause of action in small claims court. The prevailing party would be entitled to court costs and attorney's fees.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
