FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections, Department of Social Services**, and the **Office of the Attorney General** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Administration – Division of Design and Construction (COA)** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency. In response to a similar proposal in a previous legislative session, COA officials indicated that in times of rapid prison population growth, it could reduce the state and political subdivisions' options to contract for space and result in the overbuilding of jail capacity.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal could have a fiscal impact on small businesses who operate or manage correctional facilities or jails.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation would prohibit the operation or management of any correctional facility or jail within Missouri by a private person, corporation, partnership, business, association or other entity unless the facility or jail were already in operation before January 1, 2002. The provisions of this proposal would not apply to the Division of Youth Services.
