FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation requires every school in this state that is supported in whole or in part by public monies to ensure that the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America is recited in at least one scheduled class of every pupil enrolled in that school no less than once per week. However, no student shall be required to recite the Pledge of Allegiance if that student or that student's parent or legal guardian expresses a conscientious objection to the classroom teacher or school principal.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
