FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses that are licensed to operate in the State of Missouri that do not currently have insurance that covers the requirements of this proposal, would be expected to have an increase in insurance costs from providing the required insurance.

DESCRIPTION

This act requires ambulance service owners to carry liability insurance to cover negligent care by their employees. Currently, Section 190.120, RSMo, requires ambulance service owners to carry

insurance to cover the injury or death of persons in accidents due to any cause and to cover property damage. This act provides that owners must also carry coverage for the injury or death of an individual due to the owner's negligence in employing a person who negligently administers emergency care.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
