Legislative Accomplishments in 2013

While I was disappointed lawmakers did not expand Medicaid for thousands of Missourians under the Affordable Care Act, I am pleased that several of my amendments were attached to legislation that moved forward during the 2013 session.

As a member of the minority party, it is somewhat difficult to pass legislation, so my goal was to amend, or change, bills during the legislative process on the Senate floor.

For example, by sitting down with the Senate sponsor of a House bill that expanded Second Amendment rights in Missouri,

I was able to improve the bill and change its focus on safety. Ultimately, this legislation was vetoed by the governor. However, it is important to note that my work resulted in a compromise regarding a bill that would have protected gun owners' rights while also keeping guns out of the hands of the wrong people, such as children and gang members.

In addition, I worked handin-hand with my colleagues on several measures in committee, which were ultimately passed by the Legislature and signed by the governor.

Other Legislative Accomplishments

- **Senate Bill 251** Updates provisions relating to public assistance fraud and abuse (signed by the governor on July 8, 2013).
- **Senate Bill 170** Allows members of public governmental bodies to cast roll call votes in a meeting if the member is participating via videoconferencing (truly agreed to and finally passed).
- Senate Bill 75 Modifies provisions relating to firearms, sheriffs, intruder training and gun safety in public school, source documents for driver's licenses, knives, and concealed carry permits (signed by the governor on July 12, 2013).
- **Senate Bill 125** Modifies duties of boards of education (signed by the governor on July 12, 2013).
- Senate Bill 366 Creates the Rebuild Damaged Infrastructure Program, transfers moneys between certain funds, and creates a tax exemption for disaster relief services (language included in SB 23, signed by the governor on July 5, 2013).
- House Bills 303 & 304 Designates several highways and bridges located in Missouri (signed by the governor on July 10, 2013).
- House Bill 436 Establishes the Second Amendment Preservation Act, which rejects all federal acts that infringe on a Missouri citizens' rights under the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution (truly agreed to and finally passed).
- **House Bill 533** Changes the laws regarding firearms (signed by the governor on July 5, 2013).

2013 Sponsored Legislation:

- SB 123 Modifies provisions relating to taxes on hotels and motels in fourth class cities.
- **SB 124** Creates the crime of failing to stop illegal firearm possession, neglect storage of a firearm, and failure to notify a school of firearm ownership.
- **SB** 168 Modifies the use of student assessment data when calculating a school district's performance when a school district receives students as a result of a change in district boundaries.
- **SB 170** Allows members of public governmental bodies to cast roll call votes in a meeting if the member is participating via videoconferencing.
- **SB** 171 Provides that charter school sponsors are responsible for all expenditures associated with the closure of a charter school they sponsor.
- **SB** 172 Prohibits a workforce development agency from knowingly omitting from any bidding process an entity with whom it has a contract.
- SB 198 Requires, subject to appropriations, an expansion of the variety
 of kosher foods approved under the Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
 Special Supplemental Food Program.
- SB 199 Requires long-term care facilities to be encouraged to institute
 policies encouraging familial involvement in the well-being and support of
 its residents.
- **SB 200** Allows school districts and charter schools to establish and implement an age-appropriate curriculum to educate students about domestic violence and teen dating violence prevention.
- SB 202 Enacts a state-wide smoking ban.
- SB 203 Repeals provisions relating to unauthorized and unlawfully present aliens.
- SB 362 Licenses clinical laboratory personnel.
- SB 363 Establishes the Residential Electronic Products Recycling and Reuse Act and repeals the Manufacturer Responsibility and Consumer Convenience Equipment Collection and Recovery Act.
- **SB 390** Requires any school board that sponsors a charter school to use an estimate of the district's current year weighted average daily attendance.
- **SB 429** Authorizes the cities of Edmundson and Woodson Terrace to charge a transient guest tax.
- SB 430 Modifies provisions relating to adult day care programs.
- SB 469 Creates the crimes of failing to stop illegal weapon possession, negligent storage of a weapon, and failure to notify a school of weapon ownership.
- SCR 10 Urges Congress to treat immigrants with dignity and respect in changing federal immigration policy.

- **SCR 11** Urges U.S. Congress to transfer authority for the remediation of the West Lake Landfill radioactive wastes from the EPA to the Corps of Engineers' Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program.
- SJR 13 Makes St. Louis City part of St. Louis County.
- **SR 777** Use of the Chamber/21st Century Leadership Academy.
- HCR 16 Encourages the Missouri Veterans Commission to work with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs to address the needs of women veterans and formally honors the heroic service of women veterans.

- NOTICE REQUIRED ON UTILITY CUTOFFS -

During the winter heating season, Missouri gas and electric utilities regulated by the Missouri Public Service Commission must give customers at least 10 days written notice before service may be disconnected and additional written or personal contact at least 96 hours prior to disconnection. Additionally, no disconnections may occur on any day in which the temperature is forecast to be below 30 degrees.

These rules, which are in effect between Nov. 1 and March 31, require also that customers whose service is about to be cut off be told that they might qualify for financial aid to help pay their utility bills. Elderly or handicapped customers who register with utilities in advance are given even greater protection by the new rules.

- VOTER REGISTRATION -

Voting is the right and responsibility of all qualified citizens. Eligible voters are required to be at least 18 years of age, a resident of the state and a citizen of the United States.

Upon reaching 18 or moving to Missouri, anyone desiring to register to vote can do so by taking valid identification to a local registration location. This must be done by the fourth Wednesday prior to any election in order to vote in that particular election. After registering, you're eligible to vote in any election.

To obtain a list of the registration locations nearest you, contact the St. Louis County Board of Election Commissioners at 314-615-1800. You can register at the election board office and at most libraries, city halls, division of motor vehicle offices and school district offices.
